

MINUTES } CITY OF PIKEVILLE

At a regular meeting of the Common Council of the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened and held at the city hall in said city on the 19th day of February, 1929, the following were present, Mayor, Geo. Pinson Jr., Councilmen, Rush Sword, Richard Thompson, Oscar Jackson and I.E. Brooks.

Councilman, I.E. Brooks, moved that the contract between the City of Pikeville, Kentucky and the Campbell-Johnson Company, of date February 19th, 1929, for the construction of the sewer in the south end of the city, and having been approved by the City Treasurer, be accepted and approved, and upon motion duly seconded by Rush Sword, carried by a unanimous vote.

Campbell-Johnson Company presented bond of date February 19th, 1929, with A.S. Johnson and W.H. Campbell as personal sureties, for the faithful performance of the Sewer Contract, in the sum of \$3100.00, and councilman, Rush Sword moved that said bond be accepted and approved and said motion being duly seconded by I.E. Brooks, carried by a unanimous vote.

T.M. Stratton, Policeman, having requested a leave of absence as Policeman of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, until the 1st day of August, 1929, without pay, Councilman, Rush Sword moved that a leave of absence be granted the said T.M. Stratton as Policeman until the 1st of August 1929, without pay, from this date, and said motion being duly seconded, carried by a unanimous vote.

Councilman, G.H. Francisco now present.

It appearing that there is now a vacancy in the office of Policeman of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, by reason of the leave of absence granted to T.M. Stratton, until August 1st, 1929, Councilman, I.E. Brooks nominated Code Ramsey as Policeman, to take the place of T.M. Stratton and that he be employed and appointed as policeman until August 1st, 1929, at a Salary of \$125.00 per month, at which time said employment and appointment shall terminate, and there being no other nominations, upon a roll call the vote was as follows:

The result of the vote being announced the mayor declared said motion carried and the said Code Ramsey appointed and employed as Policeman until August 1st, 1929, at a Salary of \$125.00 per month.

Code Ramsey being present in open council accepted said appointment and took the oath of office as required by law and entered upon his duties as Policeman.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, council is adjourned until the next regular meeting date.
