

MINUTES } CITY OF PIKEVILLE

At a regular meeting of the Common Council held on the 19th day of March, 1929, at the city hall in said city, the following were present: Mayor, Geo. Pinson Jr., Councilmen, Oscar Jackson, G.H. Francisco, Rush Sword and Richard Thompson.

The minutes of the council not heretofore read and approved and now read and approved.

The Committee appointed to investigate and report on the bill filed by Call Bros. Hdwe. Co. asks to be given further time in which to report, which is granted.

Councilman, Richard Thompson moved that A.S. Johnson be employed to make Audit of the City Administration and Water Works Department for the year 1928, and up to March 4th 1929, for the sum of \$100.00, and said motion being duly seconded, carried by a Unanimous vote.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, J.Lee Hatcher is appointed as Deputy Assessor of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky for the year 1929, and the Assessor, Nora L. Thornbury, is to receive the sum of \$100.00 as Assessor and J.Lee Hatcher is to receive \$100.00 as Deputy Assessor, out of the Salary paid to the Assessor, from the city of Pikeville, Kentucky.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, it is ordered that J.Lee Hatcher be allowed, upon completion of the assessment of the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, for the year 1929, the sum of \$75.00, in addition to the \$100.00 to be paid him out of the salary of the Assessor, for making the assessment for the year 1929.

J.Lee Hatcher being present in open council accepted said appointment and took the oath as required by law.

On motion duly made seconded and carried a building permit is granted to George E. Butler, to construct a two story brick and glass building on the back end of the J.P. Marrs lot on Elm Street, said building to conform to all the Ordinances and regulations adopted by the City of Pikeville with reference to buildings.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, the bill of the South Eastern Kentucky Utilities Company is referred to the street committee for a report on same at the next meeting of the Board.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, it is ordered that all parties furnishing coal to the Police Station and Fire Department be directed to get ticket from Fire Chief or Chief of Police or Police Judge for each and every load of coal furnished, and unless this order is complied with, no bill will be allowed for coal or kindling so furnished.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it is ordered that the Mayor appointe a committee to secure a place in which to store the fire hose.

The Mayor, pursuant to the above order appointed on said committee to secure a place in which to keep the Fire hose, Richard Thompson, G.H. Francisco, and J.C. Williamson, and they are directed to report at their next meeting of the Board their findings and recommendations.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried the following order is entered: "WHEREAS, the Southeastern Kentucky Utilities Company, having filed a bond in the penalty of Two Thousand and no/100 (\$2,000.00) Dollars, dated January 26th 1929, executed by the Royal Indemnity Company, as Surety, running to the City of Pikeville, Pike County, Kentucky, in lieu of a franchise bond in the same amount, filed by the Federal Public Utilities Company of Kentucky, dated October 15th 1928, with the Royal Indemnity Company as Surety, the City of Pikeville hereby releases the Federal Public Utilities Company of Kentucky as Principal from all liability under is bond dated October 15th 1928, from any future liability on said bond, from this date, but does not release them on said bond for any damage heretofore incurred, any they are held liable on said bond for any damage not now known but which may hereafter appear up to this date.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, the Bond of the Southeastern Kentucky Utilities Company as Principal and the Royal Indemnity Company, to the City of Pikeville, Pike County, Kentucky, in the sum of \$2,000.00 of date the 26th day of January 1929, is hereby approved and accepted.

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ORDERED THAT:

K.F. Keathley be allowed the sum of Two Hundred Forty Four and 40/100 (\$244.40) Dollars, for cost and commission in making tax sales as Tax Collector for the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, for the years 1922, 1923 and 1924, payable out of the General Expenditure Fund.

ORDERED THAT:

The Kentucky Wholesale Company be allowed the sum of Fifteen and 50/100 (\$15.50) Dollars, for bill of the 14th day of March 1929, for Soda furnished the Fire Department, payable out of the Fire Department Budget Fund.

ORDERED THAT:

The Chemical National Bank of New York be allowed the sum of \$8.94, for Commission for paying Pikeville City, Kentucky coupons due January 1, amounting to \$3575.00 at the rate of 1/4 of 1%, payable out of the water fund.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried the settlement made by the city clerk with the Police Judge for the month of January and February are read and approved and ordered spread at large on the book kept for that purpose.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, the settlement made by the City Clerk with the Police Chief for the months of January and February are read and approved and ordered spread at large on the book kept for that purpose.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried the Council is adjourned until the next regular meeting date.

On motion of G.H. Francisco duly seconded by E.E. Trivette and carried by a unanimous vote, it is ordered that the transfer of the Gas Franchise from the Federal Public Utilities Company of Kentucky to Southeastern Kentucky Utilities Company be spread on the Minute Book of this Council, which is as follows:
