

MINUTES } CITY OF PIKEVILLE

At a regular adjourned meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened and held at the city hall in said city on the 14th day of May 1929, the following were present: Mayor, Geo. Pinson Jr., Councilmen, Oscar Jackson, Rush Sword and Richard Thompson.

On motion duly made seconded and carried it is ordered that a building permit be granted to T.G. Parker to construct a news stand on Main Street, to conform to the regulations and Ordinances of the city governing same.

Councilman, I.E. Brooks now present and acting. Also councilman G.H. Francisco now present and acting.

On motion made duly seconded and carried it is ordered that a committee be appointed to go over the City Tax tickets for the years 1925 and 1926 and make such recommendations as they deem fit and proper with said taxes.

The Mayor pursuant to the above order appointed as a Committee to go over the taxes tickets for the years 1925 and 1926, Councilmen, G.H. Francisco, Richard Thompson and Rush Sword and the City Clerk, J.E. Sanders.

Councilman, I.E. Brooks introduced and read an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance providing for and directing the sale of \$11,000.00 Sewer Bonds voted by the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, at the November Election, 1923; and the proceeds thereof applied to the construction of sewers in the City of Pikeville, by original construction or by re-construction of present sewers", and moved the adoption of same, and upon a roll call the vote was as follows:

The result of the vote being announced the Mayor thereupon declared said motion carried and said Ordinance adopted.

On motion duly made seconded and carried it is ordered and directed that the Purchasing Department of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, will advertise and receive prices on Twelve Hundred (1200) feet of 36 inch sewer pipe and Six Hundred (\$600) feet of 24 inch pipe. Said pipe shall be re-inforced concrete or double strength vitrified salt glazed clay pipe of call "A" quality, up to and including the 28th day of May 1929, and report their findings to the Council at its next ~~regular~~ meeting.

ORDERED THAT:

W.T. Griffith be allowed the sum of Twenty (\$20.00) Dollars, for work on Sewer, payable out of the General Expenditure Fund.

ORDERED THAT:

Judge Layne be allowed the sum of Nine and 90/100 (\$9.90) Dollars for work on sewers as helper to W.T. Griffith, payable out of General Expenditure Fund.

ORDERED THAT:

Richard Thompson be allowed the sum of Sixteen (\$16.00) Dollars, for chairs furnished to Police Station, payable out of the General Expenditure Fund.

On motion duly made seconded and carried Council is adjourned until the next regular meeting date.
