At a regular adjourned meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Pike County, Kentucky, convened and held at the City Hall in said City, on the 29th day of June 1929, the following were present: Mayor, Geo. Pinson Jr., Councilmen, I.E. Brooks, Oscar Jackson, Richard Thompson and Rush Sword.

An Ordinance entitled "Resolution awarding to George Pinson Jr., Sewer Bonds in the sum of \$11,000.00 pursuant to Bid heretofore accepted by City Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky.", is introduced and I.E. Brooks moved the adoption of the foregoing resolution and said motion being duly seconded by Rush Sword, upon a roll call the Council voted as follows:

The result of the vote being declared the Mayor declared said motion carried and said Resolution adopted.

Councilman, E.E. Trivette now present and acting.

Councilman, I.E. Brooks, introduced a resolution proposing the establishment of certain streets in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, (To-Wit, a street along the railroad on the north side from Division Street to Elm Street, and moved the adoption of same, and said motion duly seconded, upon a roll call the vote was as follows:

The result of the vote being announced, the Mayor declared said Resolution adopted and said motion carried.

The Mayor appointed on a Committee to secure the rights of way for the proposed street, W.T. Griffith and J.S. Cline, and both being present accepted said appointment.

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On motion duly made, seconded and carried, the Light Committee is directed to secure two lights and have same places, one near the house of Evaline Burke and one at the intersection of Willis and Poplar Streets and have the light changed on the pole at the intersection of Willis Street and Kentucky Avenue.

On motion duly made seconded and carried, it is ordered that Peter Newsom be exonerated from paying taxes to the City of Pikeville, for the year 1928, in the valuation of \$2000.00, ~~and~~ the divided as follows: General Fund \$15.00, Special Levy \$10.00, and the City Collector will retain a copy of this order to be filed and made a part of his settlement with the City of Pikeville.

Councilman, G.H. Francisco, now present and acting.

It appearing that the persons heretofore named as members of the Board of Supervisors has refused to act, now it is ordered that J.D. Caudill, M.G. Bowles and H.M. Hoskins be appoints on said board.

WHEREAS, there has been correspondence relative to the laying of a sewer from Elm Street to Huffman Street along and near the C.&O. Railway line, between the City of Pikeville and the Chesapeake & Ohio Railway Company; now, therefore, it is ordered that the proposition of W.T. Griffith, City Engineer, made to the C.&O. Railway Company, relative to said sewer be approved and that the acceptance by the railroad company of the proposition made by Mr. W.T. Griffith be approved by the City Council, and that the correspondence relative to same be spread at large on the Minute Book of this Council.

ORDERED THAT:

W.B. Syck be allowed the sum of Seventeen and 43/100 (\$17.43) Dollars, for collecting \$1162.41 City taxes @ 1½ percent Commission, payable out of the General Expenditure fund.

ORDERED THAT:

J.E. Sanders be allowed the sum of Sixty (\$60.00) Dollars, for making out part of Street paving tickets for year 1929, payable out of Officers Salary Budget Fund.

ORDERED THAT:

Cumberland Publishing Company be allowed the sum of Twenty Five (\$25.00) Dollars for Street Paving and Tax Books, for year 1929, payable out of General Expenditure Budget Fund.
