At a regular meeting of the Common Council of the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened and held at the city hall in said city on the 15th day of April, 1930, the following were present: Councilmen, Rush Sword, acting as Mayor Protem, and G.H. Francisco.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, council is adjourned until the 18th day of April 1930.

At a regular adjourned meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened and held at the city hall in said city on the 18th day of April 1930, the following were present: Mayor, F.A. Connolly, Councilmen, T.N. Huffman, G.H. Francisco, D.C. Moore and Rush Sword.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, J.S. Shaver is granted a permit to erect and construct a Gasoline Station on 4th and Scott Streets, and Wright Alley, said building to be erected and tanks to be placed according to the ordinances and specifications of the City Council now in effect.

An Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance requiring all persons, firms and corporations in the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, to place all garbage, trash, waste matter in proper receptacles, and stating how same shall be disposed of; and providing a penalty for violation thereof", is introduced and read and Rush Sword moved the adoption of said Ordinance by the City Council, whereupon G.H. Francisco seconded said motion and upon a roll call of the council the vote was as follows:

The result of the vote being announced by the clerk, the Mayor declared said motion carried and said Ordinance adopted.

An Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance regulating the parking of Motor and Horse drawn vehicles in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, on certain streets thereof and providing a penalty for violation thereof", is introduced and Councilman, G.H. Francisco moved the adoption of same and said motion being duly second of T.N. Huffman, upon a roll call the vote was as follows:

The result of the vote being announced by the clerk, the Mayor thereupon declared said motion carried and said Ordinance adopted.

The bonds of J.C. Williamson, Jim Crawford and E.B. Coleman, as Policemen of the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, of date the 5th day of April 1930, in the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) each, with the Fidelity And Casualty Company of New York as surety, is presented and read and upon motion duly made, second and carried, said bonds are approved and accepted.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, the Supt., of the Water Department, is authorized and directed to reduce the amount of the monthly water bills for the County in the sum of 23-1/3 percent, so long as the county permits the city to use property belonging to them for a garbage dumping ground.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, Council is adjourned until the next regular meeting date.
