

MINUTES } CITY OF PIKEVILLE

At a regular adjourned meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened and held at the City Hall in said city on the 31st day of December 1931, the following were present: Mayor, F.A. Connolly, Councilmen, Stafford Sowards, Mack Matney, R.G. Wells, and T.E. Rogers.

The minutes of all former meetings not heretofore read and approved, are now read and approved:

Victor Bevins appeared in open Council and presented bond as City Treasurer, in the sum of Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars, with National Surety Company, as Surety of date 31st day of December 1931, and upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, same is approved.

W.B. Pinson appeared in open council and presented bond as City Treasurer, in the sum of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars, with The Fidelity and Casualty Company, as Surety, of date January 4th, 1932, and upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, same is approved.

Councilman, R.G. Wells, moved that A.D. Roberts be employed to make settlement with the City Treasurer and City Clerk, up to January 4th, 1932, and to bring the Audit of the Water Dept., up to December 31st, 1931, for the sum of Twenty Five (\$25.00) Dollars, and that the Mayor appoint a committee to assist him in making said settlements and reports, and upon motion being duly seconded ~~and~~ carried,

The Mayor appointed on said committee to help A.D. Roberts in making settlement with Clerk and Treasurer and Audit of Water Dept. Books, A.S. Ratliff, City Attorney, and Councilman, T.E. Rogers.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, the City Clerk is directed to make a report to the City Council and settlement with City Treasurer each month, on and of all moneys received or collected by him as City Clerk, and belonging to the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, and if City Treasurer unable to make said settlement, same to be made by such other party as designated by the City Council.

An Ordinance entitled "ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE COLLECTION OF DELINQUENT CITY TAXES, AND FIXING THE COMPENSATION OF THE CITY ATTORNEY FOR THE COLLECTION THEREOF", is presented and read and Councilman, Stafford Sowards moved the adoption of same and said motion being duly seconded by R.G. Wells, upon a roll call the vote was as follows:

The Settlement made by the City Clerk with the City Tax Collector for the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, for the month of December 1931, is filed and upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, approved.

ORDERED THAT:

Earl Adkins be allowed the sum of Three (\$3.00) Dollars, for one days service as Traffic Officer, payable out of General Expenditure Budget Fund.

ORDERED THAT:

Albert Bartley be allowed the sum of Three (\$3.00) Dollars, for one days service as Traffic Officer, payable out of General Expenditure Budget Fund.

ORDERED THAT:

Layne Justice be allowed the sum of Twenty (\$20.00) Dollars, for 5 nights as Special Police, payable out of General Expenditure Budget Fund.

ORDERED THAT:

Alex Robinson be allowed the sum of Sixty (\$60.00) Dollars, for 15 days as Special Police, payable out of General Expenditure Budget Fund.

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ORDERED THAT:

John Wolford be allowed the sum of Twelve and 50/100 (\$12.50) Dollars, for caring for city Garbage Dump for December 1931, payable out of General Expenditure Budget Fund.

ORDERED THAT:

Albert Bentley be allowed the sum of Twenty Eight (\$28.00) Dollars, for 7 days as Special Police at \$4.00 per day, pay for one day to be deducted from next salary check of J.C. Williamson, payable out of General Expenditure Budget Fund.

ORDERED THAT:

Cumberland Insurance Agency be allowed the sum of Ten (\$10.00) Dollars for premium on bond of Alex L. Ratliff, Police Judge, payable out of General Expenditure Budget Fund.

ORDERED THAT:

Earnest Wolford be allowed the sum of Eight (\$8.00) Dollars, for delivering Ballot Boxes in City Primary and General Election, payable out of General Expenditure Budget Fund.

ORDERED THAT:

T.N. Huffman Coal Company be allowed the sum of Six (\$6.00) Dollars, for invoices of 11-27 and 12-14, 1931, payable out of Fire Department Budget Fund.

ORDERED THAT:

Alex L. Ratliff be allowed the sum of Ten (\$10.00) Dollars for Standard Printing Company, for 1930 Service, Statute Service, payable out of General Expenditure Budget Fund.

ORDERED THAT:

Cumberland Insurance Agency be allowed the sum of Twenty Five (\$25.00) Dollars, for premium on bond of A.J. Jackson as Tax Collector, payable out of General Expenditure Budget Fund.

ORDERED THAT:

J.E. Sanders be allowed the sum of Seventy Five (\$75.00) Dollars, for himself and Walter Hatcher and Rush Sword, as committee in making settlement for and with W.B. Syck, on taxes for years 1928, 1929, and 1930, for City and School, payable out of General Expenditure Budget Fund.

J.M. Hatcher, presented oath of office taken before Leona L. McConnell, which is marked filed.

A.S. Ratliff, presented oath of office taken before J.M. Hatcher, as City Attorney, which is marked filed.

Stony Amick presented oath of office taken before Leona L. McConnell, Notary Public, as City Engineer, which is marked filed.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, council is adjourned until the 2nd day of January 1932.
