

MINUTES } CITY OF PIKEVILLE

J. M. Johnson and James Hatcher appeared before the Council and asked that they be granted relief from parking in front of Hotel James Hatcher.

R. G. Wells moved that the parking ordinances of the city be enforced. Stafford Sowards seconded said motion, which carried; whereupon the mayor directed the police department to enforce all parking laws, regulations and ordinances of the city, beginning March 5th, 1933.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried the city clerk was directed to put notice in the Pike County News advising citizens and automobile owners of the fact that the city would enforce all parking laws, regulations and ordinances, effective March 6th, 1933.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried the city attorney was directed to prepare parking ordinance for the consideration of the Council at its next meeting, to the effect that parking be changed on Second Street, and the ordinance heretofore passed regarding same, be changed to read as follows: "On the east side of Second Street between Huffman and Division Street, and on the west side from Division Street to Pike Avenue."

The City Treasurer filed financial statements of the city and water department as of February 7th, 1933.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried Council is adjourned until February 28th, 1933.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried the City Clerk is directed to write a letter to the Pikeville Board of Education, suggesting that school property on Fourth, Cline and Scott Streets be inclosed with fence.

Upon motion of T. E. Rogers, duly seconded by Uhlman Taylor and carried, the mayor is directed to sign release to the Fidelity & Casualty Company of New York of the bond of Alex L. Ratliff, as police judge, said Ratliff having heretofore resigned, which the mayor did in open council.

T. E. Rogers introduced an ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AN ORDINANCE AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATION THEREOF, PASSED AND APPROVED BY THE COUNCIL OF PIKEVILLE, KENTUCKY, AND THE MAYOR THEREOF ON THE 19th DAY OF APRIL, 1930", and moved that said ordinance be passed and adopted. R. G. Wells seconded said motion. Upon roll call the vote was as follows:

Rogers moved that the city attorney be directed to prepare an ordinance and submit same to the council, declaring property known as "Sunshine Hotel" on South Hellier Street and operated as a colored hotel, a nuisance, and that the city attorney be directed to institute suit to abate said nuisance. Uhlan Taylor seconded said motion.
