

MINUTES } CITY OF PIKEVILLE

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried council is adjourned until next regular meeting.

At a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened and held in the city hall in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 19th day of December, 1933, the following were present:

Councilmen,	Clyde Childers, Rush Sword, H. E. Syck, G. C. Call and A. S. Johnson.
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Mayor, F. A. Connolly, and councilman, Arthur Fields, were absent.

Upon motion of H. E. Syck, duly seconded by Rush Sword and unanimously carried A. S. Johnson was elected mayor pro tem, and he accepted said appointment and acted as such.

H. E. Syck moved that an audit of city's financial affairs be made, and that Jay Fraley be employed to make same at the price of \$100.00, beginning July 1, 1932, and to January 1, 1934. Rush Sword seconded said motion, which carried unanimously.

An ordinance relating to buses, taxis &c., was presented and read to the council. Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried said matter was passed for further consideration.

H. E. Syck introduced an ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE LICENSING OF, AND IMPOSING LICENSE TAXES ON, AND REGULATING THE BUSINESS OF DEALING IN AND SELLING MALT AND VINOUS BEVERAGES CONTAINING ONE-HALF OF ONE PER CENTUM OR MORE OF ALCOHOL BY VOLUME, AND NOT MORE THAN 3.2 PER CENTUM OF ALCOHOL BY WEIGHT: AND PROVIDING THAT ALL LICENSE TAXES AND BOND FORFEITUDES COLLECTED UNDER THE ORDINANCE SHALL BE PAID INTO THE GENERAL FUND OF THE CITY: AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE", and moved that said ordinance be passed, approved and adopted. Clyde Childers seconded said motion. Upon roll call the vote was as follows:

G. C. Call,	yes;
Clyde Childers,	yes;
Rush Sword,	No;
Arthur Fields,	absent;
A. S. Johnson,	not voting.

Said motion having received a majority of the votes cast, the mayor declared said motion carried and said ordinance duly passed, approved and adopted.

The mayor pro tem appointed the city attorney and city clerk as committee to prepare proper forms for application and bond for individuals or corporations desiring licenses in accordance with above ordinance.

Clyde Childers moved that Andrew J. Auxier be employed as caretaker of the fire station, effective January 1, 1934. H. E. Syck seconded said motion. Upon roll call the vote was as follows:

Andrew J. Auxier received a majority of the votes cast for said employment, and was declared to be appointed to said office.

T. M. Stratton, chief of police, recommended that Millard Burke and G. W. Young be appointed as special policemen for one week from December 20, 1933, and the mayor pro tem appointed them for said term, as special policemen.

Millard Burke and G. W. Young appeared in open council, accepted said appointment and took the oaths of office as required by law.

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Rush Sword moved that J. E. Sanders be employed and appointed as attorney to represent the city in the case of J. Lee Hatcher v. City of Pikeville now pending in Pike Quarterly Court. Clyde Childers seconded said motion, which carried unanimously.

O. O. Scott appeared before the council and asked that it take some action with reference to having removed or declared a nuisance the barn on Judge J. M. York property on lower end of Second Street, and the council passed said matter for consideration.

ORDERED THAT:

Kentucky and West Virginia Power Company be, and it is hereby allowed the sum of \$336.72 for power furnished water department for the month of November, 1933, payable out of Water Works Department Fund.

ORDERED THAT:

T. E. Newton, superintendent, be, and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$22.96 for incidental expense account as water superintendent for the month of November, 1933, payable out of Water Works Department Fund.

ORDERED THAT:

J. M. Young, Jailer, be, and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$103.30 for keeping and dieting city prisoners for the month of November, 1933, payable out of Criminal Prosecution Budget Fund.

ORDERED THAT:

Kentucky and West Virginia Power Company be, and it is hereby allowed the sum of \$4.05 for light for city hall for the month of November, 1933, payable out of General Expenditure Budget Fund.

ORDERED THAT:

J. M. Hatcher, City Clerk, presented bill for \$90.25 for issuing 361 notices for board of supervisors for the year 1933, and upon motion made, duly seconded and carried said Hatcher was allowed the sum of \$81.23. To the disallowance of the sum of \$9.02 said Hatcher excepts and accepts said \$81.23 as a credit only. Therefore,

ORDERED THAT:

J. M. Hatcher be, and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$81.23 for issuing 361 notices and duplicates for board of supervisors for the year 1933, payable out of Officers Salary Budget Fund.

ORDERED THAT:

The Johnson Motor Company be, and it is hereby allowed the sum of \$5.40 for account as per invoice of November 28, 1933, payable out of General Expenditure Budget Fund.

ORDERED THAT:

Honaker Hardware Company be, and it is hereby allowed the sum of \$1.50 for one gas burner for fire station, as per invoice of November 28, 1933, payable out of Fire Department Budget Fund.

ORDERED THAT:

Ernest Wolford, Clerk, be, and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$5.25 for copies of land tax sales used in case against Will M. Smith in Pike Circuit Court, payable out of General Expenditure Budget Fund.
