## ORDERED THAT:

Garland Carter be, and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$2.40 for work on city hall lot, hauling dirt &c., payable out of General Expenditure Budget Fund.

## ORDERED THAT:

Kentucky and West Virginia Power Company be, and it is hereby allowed the sum of \$3.96 for light for city hall for the month of July, 1934, payable out of General Expenditure Budget Fund.

## ORDERED THAT:

Blue & Gray Service be, and it is hereby allowed the sum of \$12.18 for gasoline account for police department for July 1934, as per invoice of date July 30, 1934, payable out of General Expenditure Budget Fund.

J. E. Sanders and T. H. Deskins appeared before the council and spoke in behalf of certain taxi operators regarding ordinance recently passed segregating all taxis on lot near court house, and asked that said ordinance be rescinded.

H. E. Syck moved that the ordinance recently passed segregating taxis on lot or street north of court house be rescinded and canceled. Clyde Childers seconded said motion, which carried.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried council is adjourned until its next regular meeting.

H. E. Syck moved that Mrs. Maude Cline Yost be paid the sum of \$450.00 for right of way on Cline Street pursuant to agreement. Clyde Childers seconded said motion, which carried unanimously. Therefore

## ORDERED THAT:

Maude Cline Yost be, and she is hereby allowed the sum of \$450.00 for right of way on Cline Street, pursuant to deed made by her to the city, payable out of General Expenditure Budget Fund.

Mrs. Nancy Damron appeared before the council and asked that water be extended to her home on Poplar Street; and said matter was referred to the Water Committee.

A. S. Corbin appeared before the council and stated that he had worked four years without missing a day, and asked for two weeks vacation, beginning September 1, 1934. Clyde Childers moved that A. S. Corbin be granted said vacation from water department, as asked for. G. C. Call seconded said motion, which carried.

The mayor read letter from Willis Staton, addressed to the mayor and council, of date August 17, 1934, relating to catch basins and water lines at lower end of Main Street and asking for damages; and said matter was referred to the Street Committee.

H. E. Syck introduced an ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE REPEALING AN ORDINANCE 'DEFINING A ZONING AREA FOR TAXICABS IN THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE, KENTUCKY, AND FIXING A PENALTY FOR ITS VIOLATION,'" and moved that said ordinance be passed and adopted. Clyde Childers seconded said motion. Upon roll call the vote was as follows:

The mayor declared said motion carried and said ordinance duly passed and adopted.

H. E. Syck moved that the city attorney be directed to prepare an ordinance amending parking ordinances, including the word "park ways". Clyde Childers seconded said motion, which carried.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried the city attorney is directed to investigate matter of water deposits and prepare ordinance governing same, if he deems necessary, and report to the council.

R. P. Robinson appeared before the council and asked that he be given permission to have his beer licenses transferred as to location, he having changed location of his business.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried the city attorney is directed to prepare ordinance amending beer ordinance, permitting transfer of license when location is changed only, subject to approval of the council.

The four policemen appeared in open council and asked that they each be given two weeks' vacation.

Arthur Fields moved that the four policemen be each given a two weeks' vacation, one day man and one night man only to be off at a time. G. C. Call seconded said motion, which carried.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried the city attorney is directed to prepare ordinance relating to peddlers, covering what has not been covered by previous ordinances.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried council is adjourned until Thursday night, August 23, 1934.
