Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried council is adjourned until Tuesday, September 11, 1934.

APPRO VED:

At a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened and held in the city hall in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 18th day of September, 1934, the following were present:

K. J. Day, and Clyde Childers, Arthur Fields, G. C. Call, and Rush Sword.

Councilman, A. S. Johnson, was absent.

(The Countil did not hold meeting September 11, 1934.)

W. E. Turner appeared before the council and asked for permit to install sewer from present sewer to Colored Baptist Church on North Hellier Street, same to be done under the supervision of the city engineer. Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried said permit was granted, same to be done in conformity with all city ordinances, rules and regulations.

Julien Auxier appeared before the council and stated that Mrs. Harve Damron wanted the city to put in water line to her home on Poplar Street; and said matter is passed by the council for further consideration.

F. D. McClelland, President of Pikeville College, appeared before the council and asked that new light be placed at corner of Sycamore and Huffman Streets; and the Mayor referred said matter to the Utilities Committee, with instructions to report its recommendation to the council at its next regular meeting.

George Smith appeared before the council and asked for permit from the city to connect sewer on city lot to sewer on his lot. Clyde Childers moved that said permit be granted. Rush Sword seconded said motion, which carried unanimously.

H. E. Syck moved that the Mayor be authorized and directed to sign contract with the State Highway Commission of Kentucky for maintenance of Hibbard Street from end of improved portion approximately 200 feet west of Williamson Avenue to end of bridge over Levisa Fork of Big Sandy River, a distance of approximately 829 feet. Rush Sword seconded said motion, which carried unanimously.

The mayor signed said contract in behalf of the city in open council, attested by the city clerk, on this date.

ORDERED THAT:

The Chesapeake and Ohio Railway Company be, and it is hereby allowed the sum of \$62.70 for freight on one car load of cement for new city building, payable out of General Expenditure Budget Fund.

ORDERED THAT:

J. M. Hatcher be, and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$50.00 for payment on issual of notices for board of supervisors for year 1934, payable out of Officers' Salary Budget Fund.

ORDERED THAT:

Kentucky Wholesale Company be, and it is hereby allowed the sum of \$7.39 for amount paid by said company for C. O. D. package for fire department, payable out of Fire Department Budget Fund.

ORDERED THAT:

Kentucky Wholesale Company be, and it is hereby allowed the sum of \$1.34 for amount paid by said company for freight on window guards for new city building, as per invoice, payable out of General Expenditure Budget Fund.

ORDERED THAT:

O. L. Robinson be, and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$100.00 for installing new accounting system in water works department, payable out of Water Works Department Fund.

Clyde Childers moved that V. E. Bevins, City Treasurer, be directed to withdraw from Water Works Sinking Fund of 5% City Waterworks Bonds, due 1954, City of Pikeville, Kentucky, Sewer Bonds, in the sum of \$11,000.00 now held in,

and considered as a part of said Sinking Fund. Arthur Fields seconded said motion, which carried unanimously.

Arthur Fields moved that V. E. Bevins, City Treasurer, be directed to bring into city council in open session \$11,000.00 Sewer Bonds of the City of Pikeville, which have just been withdrawn from City Waterworks Sinking Fund, for purpose of cancellation, and that same shall at that time be canceled. Clyde Childers seconded said motion, which carried unanimously.

Clyde Childers moved that V. E. Bevins, City Treasurer, be directed to transfer all funds now held by him as said city treasurer in the Sinking Fund for the retirement of City of Pikeville Sewer Bonds, amounting to \$3007.03, into the City Waterworks Sinking Fund for the retirement of City 51% Waterworks Bonds due year 1954. Rush Sword seconded said motion, which carried unanimously.

Clyde Childers moved that V. E. Bevins, City Treasurer, be, directed to transfer into Sinking Fund of City Waterworks 52% Bonds, due year 1954, the sum of \$4,891.60 from the City Waterworks current account which, together with the sum of \$3007.03 above referred to, totaling \$7898.63, makes a total in said City Waterworks 51% Bonds Sinking Fund of \$22,927.75, the amount required to be in said 51% Waterworks Bonds Sinking Fund July 1, 1934, as shown by audit of O. K. Hayslip made June, 1934; the City having heretofore retired said 5% Waterworks Bonds, due 1954, in the amount of \$35,000.00. Rush Sword seconded said motion, which carried unanimously. Therefore

ORDERED THAT: V. E. Bevins, City Treasurer, be, and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$4891.60 for amount transferred into Sinking Fund of City Waterworks 51% Bonds, due 1954, from city waterworks current account, payable out of Waterworks Department Fund.

Rush Sword moved that V. E. Bevins, City Treasurer, be directed to transfer from the City Waterworks current account the sum of \$5761.29 to City 1932-1933 Budget Fund account. Clyde Childers seconded said motion, which carried unanimously. Therefore

ORDERED THAT:

V. E. Bevins, City Treasurer, be, and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$5761.29 for amount transferred from City Waterworks current account to City 1932-1933 Budget Fund account, payable out of Water Works Department Fund.

Clyde Childers moved that V. E. Bevins, City Treasurer, be, directed to transfer from the City Waterworks current account the sum of \$7096.02 to City 1933-1934 Budget Fund account. Arthur Fields seconded said motion, which carried unanimously. Therefore

ORDERED THAT:

V. E. Bevins, City Treasurer, be, and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$7096.02 for amount transferred from City Waterworks current account to City 1933-1934 Budget Fund account, payable out of Water Works Department Fund.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried the mayor appointed A. S. Johnson, Rush Sword and H. E. Syck as a special committee for purpose of investigating matter of securing rights of way for extension of South Main Street.

Arthur Fields moved that the city employ an attorney to assist the city attorney in suit brought by certain citizens of the City of Pikeville against the Kentucky and West Virginia Power Company and the City of Pikeville. H. E. Syck seconded said motion, which carried.

The mayor appointed H. E. Syck, and Arthur Fields as committee to employ an attorney to assist City Attorney in suit brought by certain citizenz of the City of Pikeville against Kentucky and West Virginia Power Company and the City of Pikeville, in which suit plaintiffs seek to cancel franchise recently granted Kentucky and West Virginia Power Company; the fee of said special attorney not to exceed the sum of \$100.00.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried Council is adjourned until its next regular meeting.
