Arthur Fields moved that the chief of police be directed to mark off place the width of Victor Lunch Building for parking of Jim Eorgen's taxicab on Division Street immediately in front of said Victor Lunch building. Clyde Childers seconded said motion, which carried.

Sidney Trivette appeared before the council in behalf of chief of police and asked that ordinance requiring parallel parking on Main Street be modified, and the council took no action on same.

T. M. Stratton, chief of police, filed his resignation as city jailer, to take effect immediately, and said matter was passed for further consideration by the Council.

Clyde Childers moved that traffic be directed up Second Street on Saturday, March 16th, 1935, during automobile show. Arthur Fields seconded said motion, which carried.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried the city attorney is allowed the sum of \$5.50 for cost necessary to file suit against certain delinquents for failure to pay street paving assessments on Jefferson Street, when said suit is filed.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried Sam M. Caudill was billed for rent for \$37.50 on city building, and W. E. Huffman for \$30.00 for rent on city building during months of April and May, 1934.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried Council is adjourned until next regular meeting.
