The mayor appointed H. E. Syck, G. C. Call and A. S. Johnson as committee to look into matter of appointment of board of supervisors, and make their recommendation of personnel of same to council at its next meeting.

A. S. Johnson stated that the clerk or bookkeeper of the water department desired a leave of absence, and moved that same be granted, and further moved that she be paid for this month's salary in full at this time. Arthur Fields seconded said motion, which carried.

It was stated by certain councilmen that there was no vacancy in the position of clerk or bookkeeper of the water department, but that the superintendent of the water department needed the services of some one during leave of absence of the clerk or bookkeeper; and A. S. Johnson moved that W. W. Gray be employed for the time being to help in the water office. Arthur Fields seconded said motion, which carried.

A. S. Johnson moved that O. L. Robinson be employed to check out the present water clerk, and that he check in Mr. Gray temporarily. Clyde Childers seconded said motion, which carried.

Mrs. Loraine Chaney be and she is hereby allowed the sum of \$100.00 for salary as clerk of the water department for the month of May, 1935, payable out of Water Works Department Fund.

ORDERED THAT:

T. M. Stratton be, and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$14.00 for amounts paid to various men for cleaning streets after flood during May, 1935, payable out of General Expenditure Budget Fund.

ORDERED THAT:

Ed Auxier be, and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$25.00 for salary as city jailer for the month of May, 1935, payable out of Criminal Prosecution Budget Fund.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried council is adjourned until May 28th, 1935.

At a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened and held in the city hall in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 4th day of June, 1935, the following were present:

George W. Coleman and others appeared in open council and asked that the Pikeville cemetery be cleaned up and kept that way.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried the city attorney was directed to prepare ordinance relating to upkeep of cemetery, cost for same to be placed on tax tickets pursuant to Kentucky Statutes, to be presented to the council at its next regular meeting.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried K. F. Lowe was appointed a member of the Board of Supervisors for the year 1935 in lieu of Garfield Sowards, said Sowards not accepting appointment heretofore made.

J. L. Morgan, A. J. Akers and Kenis Lowe appeared before J. M. Hatcher, a Notary Public in and for Pike County, Kentucky, and took the oath according to law as board of supervisors of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, for the year 1935.

Bids of Robert Williams and Lank Williams for furnishing of team, wagon &c for use of street cleaner were read to the council.

Arthur Fields moved that the bid of Robert Williams for furnishing team &c to street cleaner be accepted, said bid of Robert Williams being as follows:

"To the Mayor and City Council of the City of Pikeville, Ky.:
I offer as a bid for team and wagon for cleaning the streets
\$3.00 Three Dollars per day or 18 Eighteen dollars per week.
Bid secured by bond if required.
Robt. Williams."

A. S. Johnson seconded Mr. Fields motion, which carried, and said bid of said Robert Williams was duly accepted.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried the city attorney is directed to prepare ordinance creating the office of City Jailer, and present same to the council at its next regular meeting.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried contract between Ed Auxier and City of Pikeville was entered into, whereby said Auxier is to furnish meals to city prisoners at rate of thirteen cents per meal, covering period of time from June 6, 1935, up to and including December 31, 1935.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried Joe Justice was granted permit to erect two 1 story frame buildings on Park Street, same to be done in accordance with all city ordinances, rules and regulations.

Clyde Childers moved that D. J. Vanhooose be employed as special policeman to work on High Street June 5, 6 and 7, 1935. Arthur Fields seconded said motion, which carried.

D. J. Vanhooose appeared before J. M. Hatcher, a Notary Public in and for Pike County, Kentucky, and took the oath of office as special policeman according to law.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried Orville Clark was granted permit to erect building on Sycamore Street, same to be done in accordance with all city ordinances, rules and regulations.
