Upon motion made, beer licenses were presented and read to the council. Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried said applications were accepted and said bonds approved and the clerk directed to issue licenses accordingly.

L. G. Adkins appeared in open council and asked that a street light be placed upon Poplar Street near his residence, and said matter was referred to the Street and Light Committee.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried the mayor was authorized and directed to sign endorsement eliminating emergency clause from Standard Accident Insurance Company policy No. JC-309878 covering police car, which was done.

The City Treasurer presented financial report, up to June 18, 1935, and filed by the clerk on said date, which said report was accepted.
