At a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened and held at the City Hall, the following were present:

Councilmen, Uhlan Taylor and G. C. Call were absent.

Sidney Trivette appeared before the council relative to certain taxes which he claimed had been paid to the Clerk and the tickets retained by the Tax Collector and that the tickets should be turned over to the Clerk of the Pike County Court. ORDERED THAT: the same be referred to the City Attorney for investigation as to the status of the situation.

Also, Sidney Trivette, Attorney, asked that he be allowed the sum of \$50.00 for preparing abstract on certain property purchased by the City of Pikeville. ORDERED THAT: Sidney Trivette be allowed the sum of \$50.00, same to be paid out of General Expenditure Fund.

J. E. Sanders appeared before the Council and filed a bill for the sum of \$350.00, balance on attorney's fee, the original amount being \$500.00, for defending the City of Pikeville in an action on the question of the liability of the City on certain street assessments, which bonds had become delinquent. The Style of the action being Campbell-Johnson Construction Company vs. City of Pikeville, &c. Upon motion being made, duly seconded and carried, it was ordered that same be laid over to afford an opportunity for the investigation of same.

Mrs. G. W. Newsome appeared before the Council relative to the securing of a right-of-way over certain property from Peach Orchard down to her property toward the water tank. Same was referred to the Street Committee.
