At the regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, held at the City Hall on January 5, 1937, the following proceedings were had to wit:

An ordinance relative to regulating hours which whisky can be sold in the City of Pikeville was read, and upon motion of Mahlon Hall, seconded by T.E. Rodgers, was placed upon its passage, and the vote in favor thereof was unanimous.

An ordinance describing the type of building in which whisky could be sold, was read, and upon motion of T.E. Rodgers, seconded by Uhlan Taylor, was placed upon it's passage and the vote in favor of same was unanimous.

Thereupon, it was moved and seconded that the meeting be adjourned until January 12, 1937.
