At the regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, held at the City Hall on January 5, 1937, the following proceedings were had to wit:

The report of Judge E.E. Trivette, read and approved.

Honorable J.J. Moore and Hi Pauley appeared before the Council relative to increased lighting on Division Street, and presented a petition in support thereof, and same was referred to the Utility Committee.

Mr. Hammonds appeared relative to an allowance of the City to the Federal reemployment Agency and asked that the sum of \$10.00 be allowed for the purpose of defraying office expenses, and upon motion of Milton Tackett and seconded by Mr. G.C. Call, and the vote being taken, same was allowed in the sum of \$10.00 per month.

Mr. Smith appeared relative to light on alley at Orange Cross Building and it was referred to the Utility Committee.

An ordinance relative to the closing hours of pool rooms was read and upon motion of Dr. Johnson, seconded by T.E. Rodgers, that same be passed, and the vote was unanimous.

An ordinance relative to regulating hours which whisky can be sold in the City of Pikeville was read, and upon motion of Mehlon Hall, seconded by T.E. Rodgers, was placed upon its passage, and the vote in favor thereof was unanimous.

An ordinance describing the type of building in which whisky could be sold, was read, and upon motion of T.E. Rodgers, seconded by Uhlan Taylor, was placed upon its passage and the vote in favor of same was unanimous.

Thereupon, it was moved and seconded that the meeting be adjourned until January 12, 1937.

An ordinance relative to the licensing and regulating of whiskey in the City of Pikeville being read, and upon motion of Milton Tackett and seconded by T.E. Rodgers that same be placed upon its passage, and the vote in favor thereof was unanimous.

An ordinance licensing and regulating the sale of beer in the City of Pikeville having been read and upon motion of Uhlan Taylor, and seconded by Mehlon Hall that same be placed upon its passage, and the vote in favor thereof was unanimous.

ORDERE THAT: The following bills be paid:

Kentucky Municipal League be paid the sum of \$33.76 for City dues in said league for 1937. General Expenditure Fund.

Sportsmen Oil and Gas Company be paid the sum of \$22.54 as per inv. of 12/31/36. Gen. Expenditure Fund.

Kentucky West Virginia Power Company be paid the sum of \$12.80 as per statement 200-5400. Four traffic lights at \$3.20 each. Gen. Expenditure.

Southern Public Service Company be paid the sum of \$14.20 for gas for City Hall for December 1936. Gen. Expenditure Fund.

Kentucky West Virginia Power Company be paid the sum of \$7.30 Service from Nov. 13 to Dec. 14th. 1936. General Expenditure Fund.

Kentucky West Virginia Power Company be paid the sum of \$237.95 service for December 1936. Street Lighting.

Home Furniture Company be paid the sum of \$11.90 for six pair blankets for city jail. Crim. Prosecution Fund.

W.W. Bennett, Agent for Prudential Life Insurance Company be paid the sum of 103.00 for renewed bonds for 1937 of City officials.

A resolution relative to the extending and improving of Main Street through to Bank Street was read and passed.

A resolution improving and extending Bank Street through to Park Street, and the improving of Park Street was read and passed.

A resolution extending and improving Park Street in and to a point near bridge in South Pikeville, was read and approved.

Hi Pauley appeared before the City Council relative to white way on Caroline Ave., and made the proposition that property owners living on Caroline Ave. would pay their said lights until the next fiscal year.

An ordinance was read relative to the hours in which beer can be sold in the City of Pikeville, and upon motion of Milton Tackett, seconded by Dr. Johnson, same be placed on its passage, and the vote being taken, all present voting in the affirmative.

V.E. Bevins City Treasure, appeared before the Council and gave his report of the financial status of the City.

It was ordered that the City Attorney draw an order authorizing the city treasurer to transfer any funds from the 1935, 1936, budget, transferring from one fund to the other to avoid payment of interest.
