ORDERED THAT: V.E. Bevins, City Treasurer, transfer from General Fund to the credit of J.C. Wilson and Company, et al, the sum of \$525.00 and a few dollars court cost, in full settlement of plaintiffs' claims, on judgement in the case of J.C. Wilson et al Vs: Sidney Trivette, etal.

ORDERED THAT: John Helvy be paid "in full" the amount of \$18.00 for hauling 18 loads of trash from city streets, in April, 1937 (payment having been held up May 4, 1937).

Doctors S.B. Casebolt, J.C. Preston and J.C. Wheeler appeared before the council relative to reservation of parking place for them on Main or Division Street.

Frank Clay, area engineer for W.P.A., presented a request that his office be allowed to erect the fire station lot, a metal warehouse, for use of W.P.A., said building to be 32 x 72 feet, and after the use by Government is over, title to said building to revert to the City of Pikeville.

Motion for allowing same was made by Councilman Uhlan Taylor, it being seconded by Councilman R.S. Johnson. Vote for granting the request:

Mayor K.J. Day, and the City Council gave permission to a committee composed of councilmen T.E. Rogers, Uhlan Taylor, and G.C. Call to negotiate for the purchase of a used concrete mixer for the city.

ORDERED THAT: The bond of Campbell and Johnson be set at \$1,000.00 for the proper completion of contract with city, to pave Hibbard Street, from point near Effie Day line to bridge approach at South end of City.

Bids of City Motor Company, Young Motor Company and the newly received bid of Johnson Motor Company, for purchase of a chassis for fire truck, were discussed; and the matter of purchasing same was passed over for purchasing committee to discuss further the chassis requirement.

There being no further business, upon motion made duly seconded and carried council was adjourned.
