A quorum being present, the following proceedings were had:

On motion being made and duly seconded, the reading of the minutes were dispensed with.

A.S. Corbin, City Water employee, asked for a vacation.

An Ordinance relating to the selling and distribution of beer was discussed.

ORDERED THAT: R. Thompson be paid the sum of \$250.00 "for taking the lists and making off assessors book for 1937". (His bill for \$250.00) having been presented under date of May 15, 1937.) Payable out of General Expenditures Fund.

ORDERED THAT: Earl Adkins be paid the sum of \$4.50 for washing and painting city streets May, 1937. Street Cleaning Fund.

ORDERED THAT: Walton Ferrell be paid the sum of \$1.75 for painting streets May, 1937. Street Cleaning Fund.

ORDERED THAT: Orvel McKinney be paid the sum of \$1.75 for painting the city streets, May, 1937. Street Cleaning Fund.

ORDERED THAT: Wade Robinson be paid the sum of \$1.75 for painting city streets, May, 1937. Street Cleaning Fund.

Johnson, which motion was duly seconded IT HIS ORDER BY THE COUNCIL that Millard Burke be and is hereby appointed fire chief of the city of Pikeville with power to hire a truck driver and a helper: these two latter employees to be hired for thirty day periods; said employees to be approved by the City Council and it is so ordered.
