AN ORDINANCE, - Entitled an ordinance, fixing a license fee for laundries, which was passed March, 3rd, 1938.

CHRIS PETROU, - Appeared before the council, for the purpose of trying to get a reduction, on his 1937, City taxes, same was continued over to the Regular Term.

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THE CITY COUNCIL, decided to not take any further steps to acquire the right of way to widen Cline street, from Yost street to the end of Scott Avenue, The prices being asked by the property owners, being far in excess of the amount the City Council felt that the City could afford to pay. for said right of way.
