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CITY OF PIKEVILLE TO RECEIVE BIDS.

Sealed bids will be received by the undersigned, at his office in the City Hall, from date to Tuesday August the 16th 1938. at 5 P.M. for cleaning the streets and alleys, and alleys, in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky. collecting garbage in the residential and business sections of the City. (Ashes excepted,) and operating the incinerator, in burning the debris, from street cleanings, and all burnable garbage, in the City of Pikeville.

Successful bidder will furnish all equipment and labor for the work. Streets and alleys in residential sections to be cleaned thoroughly once a week. In business sections (Huffman street to Pike Avenue Railroad to the river) Daily. Garbage in residential sections, to be collected one time a week, in business sections (From business houses) Daily, Bond in amount of \$1,000.00 for faithful performance is required. Contract to run from August 20th 1938, until the end of the Fiscal year. On June the 30th 1939.

Contract to be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder, City reserves the right to reject any and all bids. City to pay Monthly for the work. City reserves the right to cancel contract, upon breach by the successful bidder. Fifty Dollar deposit payable to the City. must accompany each bid, same returnable upon execution of contract.

This cause having been set for a hearing by an order of a former date, the same coming on for hearing, and both parties answering ready, The proof being heard by the County Judge, on the issues as to whether or not the act of the board of supervisors, in raising the Tax valuation, of the appellant, from \$66,045.00 to \$80,000.00 was proper, and the testimony of two of the supervisors, and of the City Assessor, were introduced, which show that said board, of supervisors, made a raise on the main street (Hatcher Hotel) property from \$40,000.00 to \$50,000.00 they made a raise on the Main street property known as the Hatcher dwelling, from \$3,000.00 to \$7,000.00 and made a raise on the Main street property, known as the Block building, from \$2,000.00 to \$6,000.00.

The further testimony introduced, show that the Board of supervisors, made a reduction of the property adjacent to the Railroad, on the Item, (25 x 30 R.R. 8 houses) \$8,000.00 and the Item 32 x 230 R.R. listed at \$5,000.00 or a total of \$13,000.00 which the board of supervisors reduced to \$10,000.00.

The board further reduced item 70 x 140, Third street, from \$2,500.00 to \$2,000.00 all of which raises and reductions as shown by the board, of supervisors, left a total valuation of \$80,000.00 which does not include the valuation of one automobile and one truck, which valuation of automobile and truck is not brought into question.

The court on hearing all the evidence is of the opinion that the tax assessments should be reduced from \$80,000.00 exclusive of motor cars, as fixed by the board, of supervisors, to \$75,000.00 exclusive of motor cars, which total assessment is ordered certified to the Clerk of the City of Pikeville, and that said Clerk in making out his tax tickets, will be governed by the valuation herein set out.

To the ruling of the court, both the Appellant and Appellee excepts. Case stricken at appellants cost.
