

MINUTES | CITY OF PIKEVILLE

AT A REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL CONVENED AND HELD IN THE CITY HALL IN PIKEVILLE, KY. ON TUESDAY, MAY, 16, 1939. AT 7-30. P.M. THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS PRESENT

The reading of the former minutes was omitted and the following orders were made.

ORDERED THAT: John A. Bentley, be and he is appointed as member of the Board of Supervisors for the City of Pikeville, for Year 1939. To serve in place of George S. Thornbury, who was previously appointed and refused to serve.

ORDERED THAT: Lon Ford be and he is hereby employed to do engineering work for the City of Pikeville, Ky. for one Month, beginning and including May, 15, 1939. for the sum of \$200.00.

THE FOLLOWING ORDINANCE WAS INTRODUCED BY J.M. AUXIER, CITY ATTORNEY.

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE WIDENING OF COLLEGE STREET. FROM ITS INTERSECTION WITH HUFFMAN AVENUE FOR A DISTANCE OF 500 FEET, TO STATION 5 PLUS 00, (SHOWN ON O.S. BATTON BLUE PRINT, AS MODIFIED,) AN AVERAGE WIDENING WITH CONCRETE INCLUDING CURBINGS OF 6' 4" ON EACH SIDE OF PRESENT BRICK, FOR RECONSTRUCTION OF SIDEWALKS, AND FIXING THE WIDTH OF THE SIDEWALKS.

THE FOLLOWING ORDINANCE WAS INTRODUCED BY J.M. AUXIER, CITY ATTORNEY.

AN ORDINANCE DECLARING WILLOW STREET AND POPLAR STREET, (FROM THE PIKEVILLE COLLEGE LINE NORTHERLY TO THE ZACH JUSTICE ADDITION TO THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE,) TO HAVE BEEN DEDICATED, IN 1920. TO THE UNRESTRICTED USE OF THE GENERAL PUBLIC, AS PUBLIC STREETS IN THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE, KY. AND ACCEPTING SAID DEDICATION OF SAID WILLOW STREET AND SAID POPLAR STREET, AS PUBLIC STREETS IN THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE, KY.

ORDERED THAT: Gertie Osborn be and he is allowed the sum of \$40.00 for 5 Days work with Truck hauling garbage for the City, Payable out of General funds.

ORDERED THAT: TROY BEVINS be and he is allowed the sum of \$24.00 for 6 Days oiling shovel for road work, Payable out of Master Street funds.

ORDERED THAT: A Smith, be and he is allowed the sum of \$5.00 for hauling stone for new street work, Payable out of Master Street funds.

ORDERED THAT: James Matney be and he is allowed the sum of \$3.00 for one Days service as special police, Payable out of Criminal Prosecution funds.

ORDERED THAT: Ed Auxier, be and he is allowed the sum of \$6.00 for one Day and one night service as special police, Payable out of Criminal Pros. funds.

ORDERED THAT: The City Clerk is directed to advertise for bids on erecting water Tank.

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ORDERD THAT:

The City Clerk is directed to advertise for bids on the purchase of 4000 feet more or less of 6" water pipe.

Upon motion made and seconded, the meeting is adjourned until 8 P.M. May 29' 1939.

THE FOLLOWING ORDINANCE WAS INTRODUCED BY THE CITY ATTORNEY J.M. AUXIER.

AN ORDINANCE OUYHORIZING THE FIRST NATIONAL BANK OF PIKEVILLE, TO RE-CONSTRUCT AT ITS OWN EXPENSE SIDEWALKS, CURB, AND STEPS IN FRONT OF ITS BUILDING ON MAIN STREET, AND ALONG SIDE ITS PROPERTY ON DIVISION STREET, AND TO NARROW SIDEWALKS BY APPROXIMATELY ONE FOOT FROM PRESENT WIDTH.

The roll call of the vote, was taken, and all four members present voted yes on the above ordinance, same was declared passed by the Mayor, Hi Pauley.

ORDERED THAT:

The Mayor and City Ttorney are hereby authorized to enter in to a contract with the Bowles Heirs, for a lease for the season or longer, on the Bowles lot, at corner of Huffman Avenue and College street, for use as a Public City playground.

The bid of Pike Floyd Coal Co. Betsey Layne Ky. to sell 4000 feet of used 6 inch water pipe, to the City of Pikeville, Ky. at 30 Cents per foot, as it is situated underground at Betsey Layne Ky. was considered and passed over to next meeting of the council.

The following bids on taking down water tank at Betsey Layne Ky. and Re-erecting same on Peach orchard Knob, in Pikeville, Ky. were received:

1, - Bid of W.E. Caldwell Co. Louisville, Ky. \$1580.00

2, - Bid of R.E. Riley, Pikeville, Ky. \$1600.00

Upon both bids being discussed and considered. The W.E. Caldwell Co.'s bid was declared to be the lowest bid, D.T. Keel, moved that W.E. Caldwell Co. bid be accepted said motion was seconded by Charley Childers. Ordered that the City of Pikeville, through its Mayor Hi Pauley, enter into a contract with W.E. Caldwell Co. Louisville, Ky. for taking down water tank at Betsey Layne, Ky. and re-erecting same on Peach orchard Knob, in the City of Pikeville, Ky. and painting same inside and outside.
