

MINUTES } CITY OF PIKEVILLE

AT A REGULAR MEETING OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE, KENTUCKY, CONVENED AND HELD IN THE CITY HALL IN THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE, ON TUESDAY NIGHT, MARCH 5, 1940, AT 7:30 P.M., THE FOLLOWING WERE PRESENT AND THE FOLLOWING PROCEEDINGS WERE HAD:

Councilman G. C. Leslie was absent. Mayor Hi Pauley was absent because of illness. It was reported by Charles Childers and Hayes Jones that the regular Mayor, Hi Pauley, had been ill for the past six or seven days, and that said Mayor Pauley, was unable to hold this meeting..

Councilman Charles Childers nominated councilman Hayes Jones for Mayor Pro Tem and Chairman of this meeting. Councilman Dr. T. J. Howell seconded the motion of Charles Childers to name Hayes Jones as Mayor Pro Tem and Chairman of this meeting. Business was called for by the chair. The following proceedings were had.

W. S. Wells, Councilman made a motion that the City of Pikeville, pass a resolution approving the efforts of the Pike County Improvement Association to get the United States Government, through the War Department, to build the proposed lock and dam project in the Big Sandy River. Councilman T. J. Howell seconded the said motion made by Councilman Wells.

Hayes Jones, Mayor Pro Tem introduced, read and made motion for the passing of an emergency ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE RE-ENACTING THE PROVISIONS OF AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE SALARIES AND TERMS OF OFFICE FOR THE FOLLOWING OFFICERS OF THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE, KENTUCKY, TO-WIT: CITY-TREASURER, CITY ASSESSOR, CHIEF OF POLICE, TRAFFIC OFFICER AND FIRE CHIEF, NIGHT POLICEMAN, FIRE STATION CARETAKER, CITY ATTORNEY, CITY CLERK, COLLECTOR OF WATERWORKS DEPARTMENT, SUPERINTENDENT OF WATER DEPARTMENT, SERVICE-MAN OF THE CITY WATER DEPARTMENT, CITY ENGINEER, CITY STREET CLEANER AND CITY TAX COLLECTOR, FOR THE TERM BEGINNING, THE FIRST MONDAY IN JANUARY, 1936, AND ENDING JANUARY 31, 1936", PASSED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE, KENTUCKY, ON DECEMBER 6, 1935, BUT NOT RECORDED IN THE ORDINANCE BOOK, SAID ORIGINAL ORDINANCE BEING LOST OR MISPLACED,"

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## ORDERED THAT:

The City clerk turn over to the City Attorney, all 1938 City Taxes in his hands which are uncollected, same being in Five books, and in the amount of \$1,296.95 And the City Attorney is hereby directed to file suit on such Taxes as he sees fit.

All Five councilmen present voted yes on the above order.

## ORDERED THAT:

The penalty Date on 1939, City Taxes be extended to April, 1st, 1940.
