J.M. AUXIER CITY ATTORNEY PRESENTED THE FOLLOWING ORDINANCE:

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR GRADING OF PEACH ORCHARD ROAD FROM STATION 25 PLUS 19 TO STATION 50 PLUS 50 SO AS TO BE GRADED 18 FEET WIDE, WITH A DITCH 3 FEET WIDE ON THE UPPER SIDE OR ON BOTH SIDES WHERE NECESSARY, FOR SURFACING SAID PEACH ORCHARD ROAD BETWEEN SAID STATIONS, 16 FEET WIDE, WITH 8 INCHES OF CRUSHED SAND STONE AS PER MAPS MADE BY LON FORD DATED JUNE, 1940.

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ARTICLE OF AGREEMENT made and entered into this 22, Day of October, A.D. 1940, by and between the CHICAGO BRIDGE AND IRON COMPANY of Chicago, Illinois, party of the First part, hereinafter called "the contractor" and City of Pikeville of Pikeville, County of Pike, State of Kentucky, party of the second part, hereinafter called "the purchaser"

WITNESSETH. That the said parties hereto in consideration of their mutual undertakings and promises, covenant and agree with each other, as follows:

FIRST, That "the contractor" shall furnish all materials and manufacture, deliver and erect at Pikeville, Kentucky, for "the purchaser" according to the plans No, 3722 Dated Oct. 15, 1940, and specifications No 40-W attached hereto and made a part hereof as much as though fully recited herein, the following works to-wit:

One (1) 300,000 gallon 38'0" diameter by 35'6" high WaterStorage Tank with fittings and construction in accordance with Purchaser's specifications dated 9-17-40, and attached specification sheet #3722, all in accordance with contractor's proposal of October 15th 1940, except that butt welding or lap welding of bottom shall be at option of the contractor. contractor's specifications #40-W attached, shall apply only where they do not conflict with purchaser's specifications. There will be red painting only which shall consist of Two (2) coats of alluminum paint or One (1) coat of red lead followed by One (1) coat of aluminum paint on exterior surfaces, and that all materials for said works shall be of good and suitable quality and the work shall be executed in a thorough and workman like manner.

SECOND, THAT "The Purchaser" shall pay to "the Contractor" for said works in funds current at par in New York or Chicago, U.S.A., the sum of SIXTY-FOUR HUNDRED EIGHTY- (\$6,480.00) Dollars, free of all collection charges, the same to be paid as follows:

- (a) Sixty per cent (60%) of the full contract price is due on shipment of the material and is payable before the erection of said works is started.
- (b) Thirty per cent (30%) of the full contract price is due and payable upon completion of said works.
- (c) The balance of the full contract price is due and payable as soon as the said works are tested or inspected and found to be in accordance with the specifications; or if for any reason on the part of the purchaser such test or inspection cannot be made, then the balance of the full contract price shall be due and payable within Thirty days after the structure is ready for test or inspection.

THIRD. That "the Purchaser" shall build the foundation for the said works in accordance with the said plans and specifications,

Dear Sir:-

We submit herewith our bid in conjunction with the construction of a new standpipe for the City of Pikeville, Kentucky. for the sum of Sixty Four Hundred and Eighty Dollars We will furnish, deliver, unload, haul and erect One 300,000 gallon standpipe on foundation provided by others at Pikeville, Kentucky.

This tank would be furnished and erected in accordance with the specifications prepared by the city of Pikeville, dated September 17, 1940. In addition to the tank proper, We include the following items of equipment in our bid;

- 10" Mushroom type vent with screen Inside and outside tank ladders,
- Roof door, Shell manhole in bottom ring, Two coats of red lead on inside of tank, Bottom, shell, and roof; 2 coats of aluminum paint on the outside of the tank shell and roof,
- 4" Wrought iron overflow extending from the capacity line of the tank to the tank bottom with flanged intermediate connections and properly secured to tank
- 4" Wrought iron neck fastened to lower side of tank at overflow connection,
- 10" Cast iron outlet connection complete with 10" lead joint in bottom of as shown on our sketch 3722,
- 10" Flanged Foot Elbow & 10" Flg'd cast Iron pipe Ab't 5'0" long,
- 4" Flanged Foot Elbow & 4" Flg'd cast Iron pipe Ab't 5'0" long
- 1-4" & 1-10" Flg'd C I Body gate valves,

We are attaching our blue print No. 3722, dated 10-15-40 which will show the general design of the structure quoted upon. This structure would be of butt welded construction in the roof, shell and bottom. We are also attaching our standard specifications No. 40-W for welded storage tanks which specifications shall apply where they do not conflict with the City's specifications.

Seventy five (75) calendar days will be required for the completion of this structure.

We attaching hereto our certified check NO. 1088 in the amount of \$650.00 drawn on the National City Bank of Cleveland, Ohio.

Terms of payment- 60% of the full contract price is due upon shipment of material and is payable before erection of said work is started. 30% of the full contract price is due and payable upon completion of said work. The balance of the full contract price is due and payable as soon as the said work is tested or inspected and found to be in accordance with the specifications. If for any reason on the part of the purchaser, test or inspection cannot be made, then the balance of the full contract price is due and payable within thirty days after the structure is ready for test or inspection.

We appreciate the opportunity of submitting this proposal and trust we may be favored with your award for this work.

Dear Sir:

At the suggestion of your representatives, Messrs. Akers and Burke, who arrived at our office this afternoon for purpose of discussing various matters in connection with your impending purchase of Pikeville gas distribution system, we are outlining our views in letter form for your consideration.

1 Final Gas Billing.

The meters are now being read and as soon as reading is completed, which will probably be today, the bills will be computed. Since this is the billing which normally would be delivered to the customers as of November 1, 1940, and due NET by November 12th, we would like to sell you this billing so that we can wind up our affairs in Pikeville with October.

2. 1940 Property and Franchise Taxes.

Based on year 1939, since 1940 assessment is not available for the property in Pike County were \$1,416.11. Assuming that your formal purchase will take place on October 17th, your portion of the taxes for 1940, accruing under your ownership, would be 7/24 of \$1,416.11 or \$413.00.

We desire to work out some arrangement whereby we will be assured of your share of the 1940 taxes when same become known and payable.

3. Consumers' Deposits.

As of September 30, 1940, our liability to the Pikeville consumers thru customers' Deposits Amounts to \$3,610.00.

In order to protect you for the contingent liability involved we are willing to place the above sum in escrow until such a time as we are able to compute the accrued interest and principal and render to you a detailed list of depositors as of date settled upon.

Should you be agreeable to the purchase of our final billing as mentioned per Item 1, above, so that we would not be required to collect this billing ourselves, we will be able to make all necessary computations and prepare list of depositors as of October 31, 1940. However, should you not care to purchase our final billing and we have to stay on in Pikeville, during November to collect it ourselves, then we will require until November 30, 1940, to clear up this liability and turn aggregate amount of outstanding

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deposits and accrued interest over to you, together with itemized list of depositors of our record as of November 30, 1940.

4. Triplicate Utility Bills

We have on hand approximately 25,000 utility bills designed for single operation billing, which we would like to sell you if you are interested. These bills are in triplicate and suitable for dual utility billing, giving an office record, a cashier's stub and a copy for retention by customer as his receipt. These bills cost us \$9.18 per 1000. They would be suitable for your gas-water billing requiring minimum of clerical labor to prepare.

5. Inventory of Materials and Supplies.

Mr. W. T. Riggs has been instructed to supply you with a list of all pipe, fittings, valves, et cetera, and will do so as soon as he completes his physical count of such items on hand.

We would be glad to have your re-action to our proposals as outlined above with the idea of having all detail matters well in hand when we go to Chicago for the formal transfer of the property.

The City of Pikeville, Kentucky has today purchased the Gas Distribution System of Southern Public Service Company in Pikeville. As a part of this transaction Southern Public Service Company has agreed to pay the taxes assessed against such property to October 17, 1940. It is estimated that the taxes due and payable as of that date will be \$1,125.00. There is accordingly handed you herewith our certified check in that amount, drawn on the City National Bank & Trust Company of Chicago, Illinois, payable to your order. You are hereby instructed to deposit such check in your bank in an escrow account, and at the time that such taxes have been properly certified by the proper taxing authority to the different taxing units, you are to pay the same, take the receipt of the collector therefore and deliver such receipt to the undersigned. In the event that the taxes for such period exceed the amount of the escrow deposit, the undersigned agrees to deliver to you such additional amount as may be necessary to pay such taxes to October 17, 1940. In the event the amount of the taxes due and payable is less than \$1,125.00, the difference held by you shall be returned to the undersigned.

The undersigned has agreed to deliver to the City of Pikeville, within

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thirty days from the date hereof, all Pikeville gas customer's deposits held by it not delinquent in the payment of their gas bills, for the period of not more than sixty days, together with the accrued interest thereon, if any. Within such thirty days from the date hereof, the undersigned will deliver to you a list of all Pikeville customer's deposits, showing the amounts due, including interest, less the amount owing by any gas customer. There is also handed you herewith our certified check in the amount of \$3,610.00 drawn on the City National Bank & Trust Company of Chicago, Illinois, payable to your order, to be deposited by you in your bank in an escrow account. Upon the delivery to you by the undersigned of such list of customer deposits, you are to deduct any sum owing by any individual customer for a delinquent gas bill prior to October 17, 1940, and pay the same to the undersigned. Any amounts then remaining shall be delivered by you to the City of Pikeville, which will receipt therefore and resume full responsibility for the due accounting thereof to the customers having made such deposits.
