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AT A REGULAR MEETING OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE, KY.
CONVENED AND HELD IN THE CITY HALL, ON TUESDAY DEC. 16, AT 7-30-P.M. 1941.

MR. WALTER WALTERS INTRODUCED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION:

"BE IT RESOLVED, by the common council of the City of Pikeville, that the City Treasurer be and he is now authorized and directed to make settlement for the Park and playground property; and upon the delivery of the two deeds for the property, the Treasurer will pay for the Bowles Heirs property Eighteen Thousand Four - Hundred Three and 21/100 (\$18,403.21) Dollars, to Mack Bowles, or to the First National Bank for Him; and will pay Six Thousand One Hundred Thirty-Four and 40/100 (\$6,134.40) Dollars to H.C. Bowles, Six Thousand One Hundred Thirty-Four and 40/100 Dollars (\$6,134.40) Dollars to Lorain Chrisman, Six Thousand One Hundred Thirty-Four and 41/100 (\$6,134.41) Dollars, to Josephine Kirk; and will pay for the portion of the C.C. Bowles lot as conveyed the sum of Eight Thousand (\$8,000.00) Dollars, payable Two Thousand Six Hundred Sixty-Six 67/100 (\$2,666.67) Dollars to H.C. Bowles, Two Thousand Six Hundred Sixty-Six and 67/100 Dollars (\$2,666.67) Dollars, to Loraine Chrisman, and Two Thousand Six Hundred Sixty-Six and 66/100 (\$2,666.66) Dollars to Josephine Kirk; making a total of Eight Thousand Eight Hundred One and 07/100 (\$8,801.07) Dollars payable to each of the three, that is H.C. Bowles, Loraine Chrisman, Josephine Kirk.

"The deeds referred to are executed to Pikeville Park and improvement association, Incorporated; and contemporaneously with the payment of such money, such Pikeville Park and improvement Association, Incorporated, will deliver to the City a deed for the same property.

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"In the deeds for the Bowles Heirs property, vendors' liens are retained to secure Two vendor's liens for the sum of One Thousand Four Hundre Ninty-two and 33/100 (\$1,492.33) Dollars, each, and bearing interest from November 13, 1939. One in favor of Jo Mack Bowles Allman and one in favor of the estate of O.C. Bowles Jr.

"The treasurer is directed to discharge the lien in favor of the estate of O.C. Bowles Jr., by paying the same to the First National Bank, administrator of his estate, upon the release of such lien by said administrator; and upon the arrival of age of Jo Mack Bowles Allman, and the receiving proper proof, of her age, ther treasurer will discharge the lien in her favor.

"All of said amounts will be paid out of the funds realized from the sale of the Park and playground bonds."

And moved the adoption of such resolution, which motion was duly seconded by J.K. Hatmaker, and upon the vote being taken, the said vote resulted as follows:

ORDERED THAT:

That the sum of \$95.10 be paid House keeping aid, being \$30.00 for 4 Months rent at \$7.50 per month, through December, 1941. For 3 stoves, for groceries and supplies. Payable out of General Expenditure Budget funds.

All six members present and voted yes on the above order.

ORDERED THAT:

Ten Dollars per Month be allowed to Hpusekeeping Aid, for each Month during the First Half of 1942. warrant to be made out at end of each month by the City Clerk, Payable out of General Expenditure Budget funds.

All members present voted yes on the above order.
