At a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, conveyed and held in the city hall in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 3rd day of March, 1942, the following were present:

Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried Charles R. Epperson was elected Mayor Protem.
