The city clerk read the call for said meeting, which is in words and figures as follows:

"TO J. K. HATMAKER, WALTER WALTERS, CHARLES E. CHILDERS, F. H. SHARP, DR. T. J. HOWELL and CHARLES R. EPPERSON:

You and each of you are hereby notified that a special meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, is hereby called, to convene in the city hall in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, on Tuesday, March 10th, 1942, at the hour of 7:30 o'clock P. M., for the purpose of entering such orders or passing such ordinances as deemed necessary to permit trucks or other motor vehicles to load or unload goods, wares and merchandise, &c.,

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on streets on which parking meters have been installed, and to enter such other orders or pass such other ordinances as council may deem necessary to regulate the use of said streets by motor vehicles, with reference to loading or unloading, &c., relating to parking meter ordinance passed January 6th, 1942, and posted January 7th, 1942.
