M., for the purpose of accepting or rejecting applications for beer licenses for the year beginning July 1, 1942, and ending June 30, 1943; for the purpose of accepting or rejecting applications for whiskey licenses for the year beginning July 1, 1942, and ending June 30, 1943; for the purpose of passing on the question as to whether or not soft drinks, cigarettes or beer may be sold in places where whiskey is sold; and for the purpose of entering such orders, or passing such amendments to ordinances or ordinances pertaining or relating thereto.

At a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened and held in the city hall in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 7th day of July, 1942, the following were present:

Rev. T. B. Ashley, T. W. Oliver, A. A. Page, and various representatives of civic organizations, appeared before the Council and asked for an allowance of \$500.00 for City Public Library per year, and stated that the City High School would furnish rooms, lights, &c for same.

Walter Walters moved that the City Public Library be allowed the sum of \$350.00 for books and personnel for year beginning July 1, 1942, and ending June 30, 1943. J. K. Hatmaker seconded said motion, which carried unanimously.

Mrs. Pearl Weddington appeared before the Council and asked that the city take steps to remedy condition caused by wall built by John Owens on Jefferson Street; and said matter was passed for investigation and consideration.

B. F. Blackburn appeared before the council and stated that the bank had broken off on his property on Peach Orchard road and asked that the city correct said condition; and said matter was passed for investigation and consideration.

William B. Thompson appeared before the Council and stated that the W. P. A. project, to-wit, making map of city, lacked \$40.00 to complete index cards for map which City Engineer, Lon Ford, is making, and asked for an allowance of same. And said matter is passed for further consideration.
