At a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened and held in the city hall in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 20th day of April, 1943, the following were present:

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried it is ordered that Joe Dils be allowed the sum of \$9.72 for overpayment on water rental, payable out of Water Works Department Budget Fund.

J. C. Williamson, City Jailer, presented check of J. M. Moore, U. S. Marshall, for dieting federal prisoners for month of March, 1943, which was directed to be turned over to city treasurer.

ORDERED THAT:

Duncan Meter Corporation be, and it is hereby allowed the sum of \$616.10 for company's part of money collected for period from March 10, 1943, to April 10, 1943, from parking meters, payable out of Parking Meter Fund, as of April 10, 1943.
