At a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened and held in the city hall in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 21st day of September, 1943, the following were present:

The report of the Budget Committee was presented and read.

J. K. Hatmaker moved that said report be accepted, adopted and approved. F. H. Sharp seconded said motion. Upon roll call the vote was as follows: J. K. Harmaker, yes; F. H. The Mayor declared said motion carried and said report duly accepted, adopted and approved.

F. H. Sharp introduced an ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE BUDGET COMMITTEE'S REPORT FOR THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE, KENTUCKY, BEGINNING JULY 1, 1943, AND ENDING JUNE 30, 1944; SETTING FORTH THE ESTIMATED REVENUES OF SAID CITY; AND CLASSIFYING EXPENDITURES FOR SAME", and moved that said ordinance be passed and adopted. J. K. Hatmaker seconded said motion. Upon roll call the vote was as follows:

Hatmaker introduced an ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE LAYING A LEVY OF FIFTEEN CENTS ON EACH ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS IN VALUE OF ALL TAXABLE PROPERTY WITHIN THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE, KENTUCKY, FOR THE RETIREMENT OF PARK IMPROVEMENTS BONDS; PROVIDING FOR ITS COLLECTION AND DISBURSEMENT", and moved that said ordinance be passed and adopted. The City Treasurer filed financial statement of city for fiscal year beginning July 1, 1942, and ending June 30, 1943.

Walter Walters moved that the City Treasurer be authorized and directed to transfer and place in the Depreciation Fund of Water Works from the General Fund of Water Works Department the sum of \$500.00 per month. J. K. Hatmaker seconded said motion. Upon roll call the vote was as follows: Walter Walters, yes; J. K. Hatmaker, yes; F. H. Sharp, yes; Charles R. Epperson, absent; Charles E. Childers, absent; T. J. Howell, absent; Mayor, M. D. Flanary, yes. The Mayor declared said motion carried.

Richard Rice appeared before the council and stated that his wife, Lena Rice, had been overcharged by the water department in the sum of \$1.80, and the superintendent of the water department recommending that said amount be refunded, upon motion made, duly seconded and carried, it is ordered that she be refunded the sum of \$1.80 out of Water Works Department Fund.

P. H. Owens appeared before the council and asked that the sewer be extended on South College Street from end of present pavement on around road for a distance of about 270 feet from end of pavement; and upon motion made, duly seconded and carried said matter is referred to the City Engineer, who will investigate said matter and report to the council.
