

MINUTES } CITY OF PIKEVILLE

At a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened and held in the city hall in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 27th day of February, 1945, the following were present:

Councilmen, H. L. Robinson and Charlie Sowards, were absent.

O. T. Hinton, Attorney, appeared before Council in behalf of Pinson Transfer Company, and presented an ordinance amending Parking Meter ordinance and asked Council to pass same.

Councilman, H. L. Robinson, is now present.

J. K. Hatmaker introduced an ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CERTAIN PARTS OF AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED: 'AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO TRAFFIC AND REGULATING THE USE OF THE FOLLOWING PUBLIC STREETS OF THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE, KENTUCKY, TO-WIT: Main Street, its entire length; Second Street between Huffman Street and Pike Avenue; Huffman Street, between Main Street and College Street; Caroline Avenue, its entire length; Grace Avenue, its entire length; Division Street, its entire length; Establishing Parking Meter Zones; Providing for the installation, regulation and control of the use of Parking meters, and Parking Meter Zones; Providing that Revenue received from Parking Meters shall be used exclusively for the purchase, maintenance and repair of the same and for policing said zones, and the elimination of traffic hazards on the streets of the City; and prohibiting parking within designated spaces; and providing a penalty for the violation hereof". As Amended by ordinance of March 26, 1942,"

and moved that said ordinance be passed and adopted.
Walter P. Walters seconded said motion. Upon roll call the vote was as follows:

The Mayor declared said motion carried and said ordinance duly passed and adopted.

ORDERED THAT: Sid Taylor be, and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$4.30 for serving one day as special policeman, as per invoice dated 11-14-44, payable out of Criminal Prosecution Budget Fund.

ORDERED THAT: E. K. Huffman be, and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$52.10 for labor, as per invoice dated 2-27-45, payable out of Street Cleaning Budget Fund.

ORDERED THAT: Blake Johnson be, and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$58.10 for labor, as per invoice dated 2-27-45, payable out of Street Cleaning Budget Fund.

B. F. Wright be, and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$62.70 for labor, as per invoice dated 2-27-45, payable out of General Expenditure Budget Fund.

ORDERED THAT:

Cash W. Hatfield be, and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$12.90 for serving 3 days as special policeman, as per invoice dated 2-27-45, payable out of Criminal Prosecution Budget Fund.

ORDERED THAT:

A. J. Akers be, and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$370.00 for commission on collection of taxes, as per invoice dated 2-27-45, payable out of General Expenditure Budget Fund.

ORDERED THAT:

Southern Bell Telephone and Telegraph Company be, and it is hereby allowed the sum of \$6.45 for service for phone No. 223, as per invoice dated 2-16-45, payable out of Criminal Prosecution Budget Fund.

ORDERED THAT:

Southern Bell Telephone and Telegraph Company be, and it is hereby allowed the sum of \$2.70 for service for phone No. 226, as per invoice dated 2-16-45, payable out of Fire Department Budget Fund.

ORDERED THAT:

J. L. Morgan be, and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$42.00 for salary as superintendent of street cleaning for February, 1945, payable out of Street Cleaning Budget Fund.

On January 10, 1945, E. E. Trivette, Police Judge, filed with the city clerk certificates showing that Fred Stone, C. W. Hatfield and Joe Matthews, had appeared before him and taken all oaths as required by law as policemen of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, for terms expiring first Monday in January, 1946.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried Council is adjourned until its next regular meeting.
