

# MINUTES CITY OF PIKEVILLE

At a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened and held in the city hall in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 10th day of April, 1945, the following were present:

Councilmen, H. L. Robinson and Charlie Sowards, were absent.

The city clerk read the minutes of meetings of February 13, 1945, February 27, 1945, March 13, 1945, and March 27, 1945, which were read and approved.

E. E. Trivette, Police Judge, filed report for month of March, 1945, showing monies collected, and disbursed, as follows: Amount collected, \$1509.90; amount paid out, \$532.00; amount due city, \$977.90.

Letter from A. R. Venters, Chairman, Pikeville Public Library Board, of date March 9, 1945, containing activities of said Board, &c., was presented and filed.

Letter from Mrs. Evelyn D. Cassidy, City Chairman, American Red Cross, of date April 4, 1945, was presented and read to Council, which letter requested donation of \$500.00 to American Red Cross.

Walter P. Walters moved that there be donated to the American Red Cross the sum of \$500.00, payable out of Parking Meter Fund. F. H. Sharp seconded said motion. Upon roll call the vote was as follows:
