At a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened and held in the city hall in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 23rd day of October, 1945, the following were present:

Councilmen, J. K. Hatmaker, F. H. Sharp and G. C. Call were absent.

Walter P. Walters moved that the following order be entered and approved:

"IT IS ORDERED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE:

That a greater volume of gas than can be produced from the wells already drilled on the 2000 acre leasehold referred to in the writings between United Carbon Company and South Eastern Kentucky Fuel Company and the predecessors of the City of Pikeville is required for supplying the consumers of the gas distribution system in the City of Pikeville. The daily maximum delivery requirements of natural gas for the consumers of the City of Pikeville have now reached 1,560,000 cubic feet; and the City Clerk is directed to send a copy of this order to Eastern Kentucky Exploration Company, successor of South Eastern Kentucky Fuel Company, and H. H. Ramey's Estate, and will arrange to forward such copies by registered mail.

In addition to the foregoing it is further noted that the gas lines between the wells of United Carbon Company and the gas lines owned by the City of Pikeville, that is to say, between the point where United Carbon delivers the gas to the Exploration Company and H. H. Ramey's Estate, and the point at which the Exploration Company and H. H. Ramey's Estate deliver the gas to the city, have not heretofore received adequate maintenance by the Exploration Company and H. H. Ramey's Estate, and that same have been allowed to become water-logged and to freeze, and that same have not received the attention required to keep same in proper working order, and that failure of the lines has occurred during seasons when the demand for gas is greatest. This situation must be corrected during the coming winter and existing lines must be kept open at all times."

H. L. Robinson seconded said motion, which carried unanimously.

At a regular adjourned meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened and held in the city hall in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 30th day of October, 1945, the following were present:

Councilmen, F. H. Sharp and G. C. Call, were absent.

Walter P. Walters introduced and moved that the following order be entered, adopted and approved:

"It is now ordered by the common council of the City of Pikeville:

There being a substantial question as to the amount of compensation collected by the City Attorney during the current calendar year, and the year 1943 and the year 1944,

The police judge is directed to make a report to this council at its next regular meeting, showing how much in attorney fees and commissions was paid to the city attorney for the year 1943; how much in attorney fees and commissions was paid to him in the year 1944; and how much in attorney fees and commissions was paid to him in the year 1945.

The police judge is directed to pay no further sums, either by way of attorney fees or commissions, to the city attorney until he has received further directions from the council.

Until the further orders of the council, the police judge will hold all taxed attorney fees, commissions and other sums which have come into his hands, or that may hereafter come into his hands on account of the city attorney."
