

# MINUTES } CITY OF PIKEVILLE

At a regular semi-monthly meeting of the common council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened and held in city hall on the 24 th. day of October, 1960, at 7:30 p.m. the following were present:

The City Clerk read the minutes of the previous meeting. Upon completion the Mayor ask if there be any corrections or additions. The Council having voiced some corrections to be made, the Mayor declared the minutes approved subject to correction. These corrections have been made.

After the City Clerk read an ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE PARKING OF MOTOR VEHICLES ON AUXIER AVENUE BETWEEN THIRD STREET AND THE C. AND O. RAILROAD COMPANY TRACTS AND PROVIDING FOR A LOADING AND UN-LOADING ZONE AND THREE METERED PARKING SPACES ON SAID STREET AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE", J. A. Shockey made a motion to adopt the ordinance as read, the penalty provision to be reduced from a maximum \$50.00 to \$5.00 per offense. Harry Spears seconded the motion and the vote on the motion was as follows:

The Mayor declared the motion carried.

The Council directed City Attorney, Jack Page, to prepare an ordinance restricting the parking around City Hall. The parking spaces in front of the Utilities Office and Police Court to have 15 minute parking for customers, the area in front of the Fire Station to be restricted to City employees on duty to park on the side, and no parking at anytime in the lanes used by the fire trucks.

The Mayor read the following letter dated October 24, 1960 submitted by the City Attorney, "Effective November 1, 1960, I have been appointed to serve as U. S. Commissioner. This position is incompatible with the position of City Attorney of the City of Pikeville.. For the above reason I do hereby submit my resignation as City Attorney of the City of Pikeville, effective as of the end of October 31, 1960. It has been a real pleasure to serve the City of Pikeville and I will be glad to assist my successor in every way possible. s/s Jack T. Page" J. A. Shockey made the motion to accept the resignation of Jack T. Page as City Attorney. Homer Dalton seconded the motion and the vote on the motion was as follows:

The invoice of the firm of Hurley and Hamilton in the amount of \$375.00 for repair to the roof of the Fire Station was brought before the Council. The Council decided not to pay the bill until the work had been done.

Combs as City Attorney effective November 1, 1960. The amendment to change the effective date to November 15, 1960. The motion was seconded by J. A. Shockey and the vote on the motion was as follows:
