After Mr. Butcher's recommendation, Allen Charles made the motion to give the Methodist Hospital and the Pike County School for Retarded Children the same rate on gas and water and the city school has, which is \$.43 per thousand cubic feet of gas and \$.10 per thousand gallons of water. Dr. W. C. Hambley, Mayor read an audit of all the accounts of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, submitted the the City Auditor, D. L. Authenrieth. The audit's read by the Mayor are now on file in the City Clerk's office.

Harry Spears made the motion instructing the City Clerk to prepare a list of all persons who have bought City Licenses for this year and turn the list over to the Chief of Police, so the Chief can check on the persons who do not have a license.
