

MINUTES } CITY OF PIKEVILLE

Harry Spears initiated the discussion of the removal of the fence on the C & O Right away between Thelma and Auxier Streets and parrell with Cline Street, if the C & O would agree to have the fence removed the City would take care of having the weeds cut and the area mowed. The Council instructed Mr. Butcher to check with C & O Officials on the matter.

The Mayor, Dr. W. C. Hambley; Councilmember, Homer Dalton; and Dan Jack Combs, City Attorney were duly sworn in by the Police Judge on the 10 th. day of November, 1960, and are performing their duties. The certificates of election of Dr. W. C. Hambley, Homer Dalton and T. L. Creekmore are on file in the City Clerk's Office.

Dr. W. C. Hambley, Mayor read an audit of all the accounts of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, submitted the the City Auditor, D. L. Authenrieth. The audit's read by the Mayor are now on file in the City Clerk's office.

Harry Spears made the motion instructing the City Clerk to prepare a list of all persons who have bought City Licenses for this year and turn the list over to the Chief of Police, so the Chief can check on the persons who do not have a license. Homer Dalton seconded the motion and the vote was as follows:

At a regular semi-monthly meeting of the common council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky convened and held in city hall on the 12 th. day of December 1960 at 7:30 p.m. the following were present:

The City Clerk read the minutes of the previous meeting. Upon completion the mayor ask if there be any corrections or additions to the minutes. The Council having voiced no objections to the minutes the mayor declared the minutes approved as read.

Mr. Butcher reported to the council that he had contacted the Power Company about the street lights installed on Fairview, and that arrangements could be made to change 5 street lights so that the road below the highway would be illuminated. Mr. Butcher said this would be done when the additional street lights were installed.

Uhlman Taylor initiated the discussion of the installation of street lights on Coal Hollow and Mood Hollow. The Council agreed to have street lights installed when the area becomes incorporated within the City.

The City Clerk read the following letter addressed to Mayor, Dr. W. C. Hambley and dated December 6, 1960, "I submit herewith my resignation as a member of the City Council of Pikeville, Kentucky, effective this December 7, 1960. Will you please present this resignation to the City Council and have it duly recorded. s/s Harry J. Spears." Homer Dalton made the motion to accept the resignation of Harry Spears as a councilmember. Bill Huffman seconded the motion and the vote on the motion was as follows:

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Allen Charles moved to appoint Harry Hobson as councilmember to replace Harry J. Spears, the appointment to be effective immediately. J. A. Shockey seconded the motion and the vote on the motion was as follows:

The Mayor declared the motion carried.

Mr. Butcher ask the council to give consideration to having persons who are building or doing major remodeling be required to have a Building Permit. The City would inspect the building on plumbing, electrical connections and sanitation. The Council agreed to give this further consideration in the form of incorporating this into a Planning and Zoning Ordinance.

Mr. Butcher reported to the Council that the City needed a pipe locator in the repair of gas and water leaks as most of the water and gas lines in the City are not charted. The amount of the locator would be approximately \$275.00. Allen Charles made a motion to buy the transistorized water and gas pipe locator mentioned by Mr. Butcher. Bill Huffman seconded the motion and the vote on the motion was as follows:

The Mayor declared the motion carried.

Dan Jack Combs reported to the council that an order had been filed dismissing the action of the proposed annexation for revision of the boundaries stated in the ordinance. The Council instructed Mr. Combs to prepare an new ordinance deleting Ferguson Creek, and including South Mayo Trail to the Baby Ritz and going north to the swinging bridge then crossing over to include Pauley Addition to end at Zack's Justice property line.

It was noted the next regular stated meeting would fall on the 26 th. day of December. After it was noted by J. A. Shockey that December 26 th. would be on the Monday after a legal holiday, J. A. Shockey moved that the next meeting would be held on December 19, 1960 rather than the 26 th. of December. Allen Charles seconded the motion and the council voted as follows on the resolution.
