After all facts were considered the Layne and Bowler Co. and General Electric Co. agreed to pay one half of the charges for a new moter. The Engineering firm agreed to pay one half of the balance if the City of Pikeville would pay the other half in the amount of \$895.00.

After Dan Jack Combs, City Attorney, gave the report of the meeting, Uhlan Taylor moved to accept the proposal of the Stephen Watkins firm to pay \$695.00 on the purchase of a new water pump motor. Harry Hobson seconded the metion and the vote was as follows:
