The city clerk read the minutes of the previous meeting. Upon completion the Mayor ask if there be any corrections or additions. The Council having veiced no objections the Mayor declared the minutes approved as read.

Dan Jack Combs presented the Judgment in the annexation and the Mayor and City Clerk signed the Judgment and it is duly recorded in Civil Ordinance Book No. 1, Pages 522 and 523. The City Attorney proceeded to read an Ordinance entitled, "AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING TO THE PRESENT CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE, PIKE COUNTY, KENTUCKY, A BOUNDARY LYING ADJACENT TO AND SOUTH OF THE PRESENT CITY BOUNDARY CONTAINING 4/10THS OF A SQUARE MILE, MORE OR LESS. Hambley, appointed a committee consisting of Councilmembers, Uhlan Tayler and Harry Hebsen; the City Clerk, Superintendent of Utilities, and the City Attorney to work on the budget for the fiscal year of 1961-1962, and directed the committee to decide where to get revenues to take care of the deficit in the budget.
