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At a regular semi-monthly meeting of the common council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened and held in city hall on the 12th. day of June, 1961, at 7:30 p.m. the following were present:

After the City Attorney read an ordinance entitled AN ORDINANCE LEVYING A TAX RATE OF 75¢ PER \$100.00 VALUATION OF REAL ESTATE SITUATED IN THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE, PIKE COUNTY, KENTUCKY, AND A TAX RATE OF 75¢ PER \$100.00 VALUATION OF TANGIBLE PROPERTY AND FRANCHISES SITUATED IN THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE, AND ALSO LEVYING A SPECIAL RATE OF .05¢ PER \$100.00 VALUATION OF PROPERTY AND FRANCHISES SITUATED IN THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE FOR THE PURPOSE OF RETIREMENT OF PARK AND PLAYGROUND BONDS AND INTEREST THEREON FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 1961-1962, AND A POLL TAX OF \$1.25 ON ALL MALE PERSONS OVER 21 YEARS OF AGE AND UNTIL THEY REACH THE AGE OF 65 YEARS, WHICH POLL TAX IS FOR THE GENERAL OPERATING EXPENSE PURPOSES, AND PROVIDING FOR A DISCOUNT OF 2% ON ALL 1961 TAXES PAID PRIOR TO THE FIRST DAY OF NOVEMBER, 1961, AND PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY OF 6% ON ALL TAXES FOR THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE NOT PAID PRIOR TO JANUARY 1, 1962, Uhlan Tayler moved to adept the ordinance as read.
