On Monday, July 10, 1961, a regular meeting date of the City Council of the City Pikeville, there was three members of the City Council and the Mayor was absent; therefore, due to the lack of a quorum no meeting was held.

At a regular semi-monthly meeting of the common council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky convened and held in city hall on the 24th day of July, 1961, at 7:30 p.m. the following were present:

The City Clerk read the minutes of the previous meeting. Upon completion the Mayor ask if there be any corrections or objections. The Council having voiced no objections the Mayor declared the minutes approved as read.

George Rich, who lives at the mouth of Hood Hollow and Turntable Hollow, reported to the Council and Mayor damages to his property caused by back water from recent heavy rains. The City Attorney said the City could not accept the responsibility of the damage until it was established by a court that the City was liable. The City Attorney recommended that Mr. Rich file suit in Circuit Court.

After the City Attorney read an ordinance entitled, AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING PARKING ON DESIGNATED AREA ON SECOND STREET BETWEEN DIVISION AND PIKE STREETS AFTER 8 P.M. AND PROVIDING PENALTY THEREFOR, Allen Charles moved to adopt the ordinance as read. Homer Dalton seconded the motion and the vote on the motion was as follows:

The Mayor declared the motion carried.

Dr. A. A. Page, President of Pikeville College, expressed the College's appreciation for the cooperation from the City during the building program of the College. He ask the Council to help share the expenses for maintenace of the semi-public street going to the College Gym from College Street. Dr. Page also spoke to the Council about the need for street repairs on Sycamore Street. Mr. Butcher said the City intended to resurface Sycamore Street after the College's building program was completed. Dr. Page also noted that the College has cleaned the river bank back of the College Gym and sowed it in grass, he suggested that the City have a drive to clean up the rest of the river bank, and to talk to the State Highway Department about cleaning the river bank along the By-Pass Road.

After the City Attorney read the Agreement between the City Council and Colonel Lear, of the Pikeville Memorial Hospital for the City to take over the water line from the City Station to the property line ;of the Pikeville Memorial Hospital, the Mayor noted that the agreement had been executed by the Pikeville Memorial Hospital, the easements and other papers are properly signed, and it is only necessary that he, the Mayor, sign the copies and send one in to the

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hospital and keep one copy. The easement will be recorded in the Pike County Court Clerk's Office. Bill Huffman moved to accept the Agreement. Homer Dalton seconded the motion and the vote on the motion was as follows:

Milford Layne, a resident of South College Street, spoke to the Council about the problem of coal dust on that street. The Council agreed to go to South College Street in body on Saturday, July 29, 1961, at 10:00 a.m. for the purpose of inspecting the coal dock to see if the operators are complying with the ordinance.

The Mayor directed the City Attorney to find out what type of ordinance could be passed in relation to clearing the river banks of trees that are too large and debris.

Uhlan Taylor moved to have a total of 12 street lights installed in the following places: 1 street light on Fifth Street, 1 street light on Popular Street, 2 street lights on Smith Hill, 1 street light on Sycamore Street and 7 street lights in Pauley Addition; and have the Power Company make a survey to determine how many lights are needed on South Mayo Trail. Bill Huffman suggested that the City and County cooperate to obtain a larger airport that could handle larger airplanes possibly a site about four miles from town on Marion Branch.
