At a regular semi-monthly meeting of the common council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened and held in city hall on the 14th dayof August, 1961, at 7:30 p.m. the following were present:

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Councilmembers: Allen Charles

Mayor: Dr. W. C. Hambley Homer Dalton Harry Hobson Bill Huffman J. A. Shockey Uhlan Taylor

The City Clerk read the minutes of the previous meeting. Upon completion the Mayor ask if there be any corrections or additions. The Council having voiced no objections the Mayor declared the minutes approved as read.

Kermit Sexton, Director of the Civil Defense Program in Pikeville, spoke to the Council about the Civil Defense program and said that anything the City could do either financially or otherwise would be appreciated. Councilmembers Harry Hobson ask Mr. Sexton to obtain figures for the building of a community fallout shelter in the City Park and bring the figures before the Council so they could make a decision.

The City Clerk reported that Boney Cline had made application for a Taxie Cab Certificate; but had later withdrawn his request.

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The Mayor reported that he had a telephone conversation with Mr. Shouse of the Planning Division in Frankfort. The Mayor reported that the City or any community that expected to benefit from planning services would have to havean organized commission to make a survey to determine what could work in the community so we would have some basis for making applications.

Bill Huffman directed the City Attorney to check about the right-of-way that would be required if the City opened up the road that would connect Peach Orchard and Coal Hollow, and also a road that would connect Perry Street into Turntable Hollow and go on down to Mildred Street.

The Council and the Mayor instructed Dan Jack Combs the City Attorney to find out who owns the property on both corners of Eighth and Cline Streets, where the service station is with the idea of obtaining theproperty for widening the intersection, and to notify State Engineers Mr. Kimper and Mr. Lewis of the findings.

The Council reported that their trip to College Street to investigate the coal docks revealed that the coal dock operater had put up more tim and dock looks good now.

Mr. Butcher reported that thesewer at the mouth of Hood Hollow had been cleaned out. The Mayor noted that the City needed equipment to do such work; that there was too much manual labor involved andit was dangerous for a man to go into a sewer because of sewer gas. The Council directed Mr. Butcher to find out what the City needed in equipment and an estimated cost of such equipment and present the figures to the Council for consideration.

After the Council discussed the various streets in Pikeville that needed repairs, the Council directed Mr. Butcher to contact Adams Construction Company and obtain an estimate of each job then present the findings to the Council so they could decide which jobs could be done.

The Chief of Police presented the following letter to the Mayor. The letter was addressed to the Mayor, Councilmembers and City Clerk and reads as follows, "I, Okie Thompson, request a leave of absence from my duties for the City of Pikeville for a period of three (3) months beginning on the 8th day of August, 1961, extending to the 8th of November, 1961, the day I shall return to my duties; with the approval of the Councilmembers, the Mayor and the Chief of Police of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky. s/s Okie Thompson, City Patrolman." Allen Charles moved to grant patrolman, Okie Thompson, a 90 day leave of absence. Homer Dalton seconded the motion and the vote on the motion was as follows:
