At a regular semi-monthly meeting of the common council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened and held in city hall on the 13th day of September, 1961, at 7:30 p.m. the following were present:

The Mayor declared the motion carried.

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The following conversation between the Mayor, City Attorney and Superintendent of Gas and Water was recorded on September 13, 1961.

Question ask of Mr. Butcher by Dan Jack Combs, Mr. Butcher as Superintendent of public works which includes the Sewage System, is it your considered opinion that the present condition of clogged sewers constitutes a threat to the health and safety of the citizens involved. To which question Mr. Butcher replied "yes".

Question ask of Mayor, by City Attorney, Mayor, as a physician are you familiar with the present condition of the sewage system, and would you consider the present condition of same to be a threat to the health and safety of the citizens of Pikeville. To which question the Mayor replied "yes".

Mr. Butcher have you studied the various types of equipment and the features of the equipment of the various manufacturers of sewage equipment, with the idea of which would best suit the City's needs. To question Mr. Butcher replied "yes", and in my opinion O'Brien Sewage Cleaning Equipment best suits the City's needs.

Question ask of Mr. Butcher and the Mayor by City Attorney; Mr. Butcher is it your considered opinion that the Rental Payment Plan offered by O'Brien Sewerage Cleaning Equipment is best for our purpose, to which Question Mr. Butcher replied "yes". Is it also the opinion of you, Mr. Butcher, and y u Mayor, as a physician, that an emergency exists and time is of the essence in the purchase of equipment in order to clean the sewers. To said question the Mayor and Mr. Butcher replied "yes".

In view of the above facts I, the City Attorney for the City of Pikeville, recommend that the Council be authorized to accept the rental payment plan offered by O'Brien Manufacturing Company for the rental on the purchase of O'Brien Sewer King # 700 at a monthly rental of \$482.14 for the first six months and a payment of \$482.16 for the seventh month until the Contract is fully performed.

Homer Dalton moved that the City contract to buy a sewer cleaner by the rental payment plan in which the City pays \$482.14 for the first six months and th the seventh month pay \$482.16 after which the sewer cleaner becomes the property of the City of Pikeville, the rental payments are to be made out of the appropriate Utilities Department and said payments are not to be considered a General Fund indebttness.
