

# MINUTES } CITY OF PIKEVILLE

Charles Mimms ask the Council for approval to build a fallout shelter at his home in Bowles Addition. The Mayor told Mr. Mimms that the City had no jurisdiction to approve or reject restrictions on building.

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At a regular semi-monthly meeting of the common council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened and held in city hall on the 9th day of October 1961, at 7:30 p.m. the following officials were present:
