

## MINUTES } CITY OF PIKEVILLE

At a regular semi-monthly meeting of the common council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened and held in city hall on the 27th day of November 1961 at 7:30 p.m. the following were present:

The City Clerk read the minutes of the previous meeting. Upon completion the mayor ask if there be any corrections or additions. The Council having voiced no objections the Mayor declared the minutes approved as read.
