The City Clerk read the minutes of the previous meeting. Upon completion the Mayor ask if there be any corrections or additions. W. E. Venters moved to to approve the minutes as read.

The following ordinance, prepared by O. T. Hinton, City Attorney, was presented by W. E. Butcher, City Manager, each of whom recommended its adoption. The ordinance is titled, AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE REGULATION, CONTROL AND POLICING OF VEHICULAR TRAFFIC AND PARKING IN THE AREA ADJACENT TO THE PIKE COUNTY COURT HOUSE AND OTHER PROPERTY IN THAT VICINITY IN THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE, KENTUCKY. Bruce Walters recommended to the City Manager that something be done to assure better collection of parking tickets. There were 2,275 tickets issued and 1,388 tickets collected. The City Manager said the tickets would be up to date by the next meeting and the ones past due would be turned over to Police Judge after notice had been sent.

W. E. Venters reported that the study of traffic conditions was not made because the Engineer from State Department of Highway had not contacted Mr. Butcher. W. E. Venters said that if the engineer did not contact Mr. Butcher that the Traffic Committee make a report of their findings and submitt them to the State Department of Highways for their objection or approval.

The City Manager reported that the City Attorney had informed Mr. Collins, of Across River, that he could not be cut off from his source of gas supply. The Commissioners took no further action.

The Mayor appointed a Finance Committee consisting of Commissioner Bruce Walters, City Auditor, David Authenrieth, the City Manager and the Mayor.

Report on participating agents and distribution of business and commissions concerning City's Insurance Policies was made by B. P. Bogardus. Commissioner W. E. Venters suggested that this matter be held over until the next meeting in order to get more information.

The Mayor read a telegram he had received from the Honorable Carl D. Perkins member of Congress, concerning the possibility of the City of Pikeville participatation in Urban Renewal and other Federal Projects.

The Mayor appointed a Planning Commission consisting of Jack T. Hatcher, John Stephens, B.P. Bogardus, Herb Kincaid, Frank Forsythe, W. E. Butcher and the Mayor.

A petition was filed by Jack T. Hatcher with the City Clerk on behalf of the citizens of newly annexed section of the Pauley Addition covering various improvements they felt should be made as they were within the city limits of the City of Pikeville; Jack T. Hatcher, reported that they would be back at the next meeting for discussion of the petition after the Board of Commissioners had had time to give consideration to the petition.

John Layne and Jeff Owens, of Across River, discussed the Garbage pick-up charge that was on their utility bill for this month. They said they had not received the service and were refusing to pay the charge. The Mayor directed the City Attorney to check on the status of the streets, in that section to see if they were under ordinance providing for collection and charges of Garbage 1 pick-up.

Mike Young spoke to the Commissioners concerning Garbage and Water charges on bill he received dated January 26, 1962. The bill is in his name but includes service to 3 units; minimum charge as provided for by ordinance was charged to this bill for each unit. No action was taken by the Commissioners.
