The Mayor read the ordinance entitled AN ORDINANCE TO VEST POLICE POWER IN ALL MEMBERS OF THE FIRE DEPARTMENT. B. P. Bogardus moved to adopt the ordinance as read; but, not to be enforced until the bonds are effective. W. E. Venters seconded the motion. The vote on the motion was as follows:

The above mentioned ordinance has been duly recorded in Civil Ordinance Book No: 1, at page 531.

The Mayor read the ordinance entitled, AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING PARKING ON, OR OBSTRUCTING PUBLIC STREETS IN AREAS BLOCKED OFF FOR CLEANING, REPAIRS OR CONTROL OF TRAFFIC. W. E. Venters moved to adopt the ordinance as read. B. P. Bogardus seconded the motion.

The above mentioned ordinance has been duly recorded in Criminal Ordinance Book No. 1, at page 225.

Mr. Joe Stone called a point of order stating that in the above mentioned ordinance there should be a paragraph stating that all previous ordinances passed that are in conflict with present ordinance are hereby repealed. B. P. Bogardus suggested that the matter be taken up with the City Attorney feels it is necessary, a paragraph will be added.

The Mayor read the following Resolution proclaiming week of March 19 through March 24 be known as Rescue Squad Week:

WHEREAS there has been organized and is maintained within the City of Pikeville, a Rescue Squad whose function and services are of great benefit and importance to the City Government its officials and the citizens of this and surrounding communities.

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NOW THEREFORE, in recognition of the efficiency and to encourage the future maintenance and functions of this organization, the undersigned, under the power and authority vested in me do hereby proclaim March 19 to March 24, 1962 as Rescue Squad Week and do hereby recommend that all officials and employees of the City of Pikeville, and each and every citizen thereof, observe this week by giving such aid and encouragement as they can to this worthy organization.

It is ordered that this proclamation be published in one of the issues of the Pike County News, next preceeding the designation period.
