The Mayor read an ordinance entitled, AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE USE OF TELEPHONES AND OTHER DEVICES FOR BUSINESS PURPOSES ON THE STREETS OF THE CITY: PROHIBITING PARKING OF TAXI-CABS AND SIMILAR VEHICLES EXCEPT IN SPACES DESIGNATED FOR THAT PURPOSE OR AT ANY SPACE FOR MORE THAN THIRTY MINUTES AT ONE TIME; A PROVIDING FOR ADMINISTRATION AND ENFORCEMENT, SEVERABILITY, PENALITIES REPEAL EMERGENCY AND PUBLICATION.

A regular monthly meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened and held in the city hall on the 14th day of May, 1962 at 7:30 p.m. The following officials were present:

The City Clerk read the minutes of the previous meetings. Upon completion the City Clerk asked that correction be made as the February 1962 bills had been recorded twice. The bills were recorded on page 56 of Minute Book No. 2 and on pages 59 and 60 of Minute Book No. 2. Bruce Walters moved that correction be made and to refer February bills to page 56 of Minute Book No. 2. The Mayor declared the minutes approved as read anc corrected.

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The Mayor read a letter from John P. DuPuy, Chairman of the Civic Committee of the Chamber of Commerce; the committee stated that they would like to express their appreciation for the delay of the passage of the Payroll Tax as was suggested by their committee, and urged that continued study of revenue measures be made.

The Ordinance previously read, imposing a license fee was changed as follows: Section III, the phrase "except that in no case shall any deduction be made or allowed for taxes of any kind or form except withholding taxes and other deductions actually with-held and paid on behalf of employees", was changed to read, "but without deduction for taxes based on income."

The Mayor read the ordinance entitled, AN ORDINANCE IMPOSING LICENSE FEES UPON ALL PERSONS ENGAGED IN ANY TRADE, OCCUPATION OR PROFESSION WITHIN THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE WHO ARE EMPLOYED BY OTHERS, MEASURED BY ONE PERCENT, (1%), OF GROSS RECEIPTS: UPON ALL PERSONS ENGAGED IN ANY TRADE, OCCUPATION OR PROFESSION FOR PROFIT, OR GAIN, MEASURED BY ONE PERCENT, (1%), OF NET PROFIT: DEFINING TERMS; PROVIDING FOR THE REGULATION, ADMINISTRATION, ENFORCEMENT AND COLLECTION OF LICENSE FEES AND THE PURPOSE THEREOF; PROVIDING EXEMPTION FROM LIABILITY FOR LICENSE FEES FOR DOMESTIC SERVANTS; IMPOSING UPON EMPLOYERS THE DUTY TO WITHHOLD, REPORT AND PAY LICENSE FEES OF EMPLOYEES: PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE; PROVIDING SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING EFFECTIVE DATES; AND REPEALING CLAUSE, in itsdentirety and as amended. The City Clerk read a letter addressed to the City Clerk and the Mayor from the First National Bank, requesting that payment be made on the note dated 10 December 1958, in the amount of \$23,733.51, the letter said no payment had been made on the principal of note since above date and requested that payment of \$5,000.00 be made as soon as possible.

Venters moved that Commissioner Bruce Walters be authorized to made an agreement for payment of the note to the First National Bank dated December 10, 1958, if possible, at whatever rate of interest is favorable to the City on an amortized plan of 48 months.
