The City Clerk read an ordinance entitled, AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AN ORDINANCE IMPOSING LICENSE FEES UPON ALL PERSONS ENGAGED IN ANY TRADE, OCCUPATION OR PROFESSION WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS OF PIKEVILLE, KY., AND PROVIDING FOR A MINIMUM LICENSE FEE FOR PERSONS ENGAGED IN ANY TRADE, OCCUPATION OR PROFESSION FOR THEMSELVES. The City Clerk read the minutes of the previous meeting. Upon completion the Mayor Protem, R. G. Wells, Jr., asked if there be any correction or additions. B. P. Bogardus moved to approve the minutes as read. W. E. Venters seconded the motion. Vote was unanimous on motion.

John Ward, editor and published of the Pike County News, Pikeville, Kentucky presented to the Mayor Protem and Commissioners a petition to repeal the Ordinance imposing license fees passed May 14, 1962 and amended June 11th and June 30th, 1962, recorded in Penal Ordinance Book No. 1, pages 228-231 and 237-242. Upon presentation he referred Mayor Protem and Board to KRS Chapter 89.250. Petition was accepted by Mayor and Board which was referred to City Attorney, O. T. Hinton.

Gene McNeil, employed as bookkeeper for Modern Appliance made a request that the Board amend the clause in ordinance passed May 14, 1962 and amended June 11, 1962, Section 5, the phrase "and report and pay the same to the administrator on or before the 15th. day of Oct., Jan., April and July of each year, for the license fees accrued during the preceeding three (3) months". Mr. McNeil stated a 15 day dead line was not enough time to complete the report and suggested a 30 day dead line would be more convenient for reporting purposes. Mayor referred request to O. T. Hinton for feasibility.

O. T. Hinton made a request that a meeting other than the regular monthly meeting be called and should be called within ten (10) days after the presentation of petition earlier in the meeting. Mr. Hinton questioned Mr. Ward to the number of names on the petition. Ward stated that there were approximately 300 names which was more than 224 needed. (Not less than 25% of the total number of votes cast for all candidates for Mayor at the last preceding regular election held Nov. 7, 1961 (894 votes).
