

MINUTES } CITY OF PIKEVILLE

At a regular monthly meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened and held in the city hall on Monday, February 11, 1963, at 7:30 P.M. The following were present as indicated:

Due to the Mayor's absence; Mayor Protem, Bruce Walters, acted as presiding officer.

The city clerk read the minutes of the previous meeting. Upon completion, the Mayor Protem asked if there be any corrections or additions. The Mayor Protem, having no voiced objections from the Commissioners, declared the minutes approved as read.

City Clerk presented to Mayor Protem a report on revenues collected and deposited in the General Fund for the Month of January, 1963. Mayor Protem read the statement as follows:

City Manager, W. E. Butcher, reported to Board of Commissioners that the Highway Dept. intends to widen the bypass road and would use gravel until weather permitted the department to blacktop. Mr. Butcher stated that no parking signs would be place from Chloe Creek intersection to nearly the intersection at Ferguson Creek. The State Highway Dept. has requested that the City Police Force give aid in enforcing the "no parking" area. Mayor Protem questioned when the above stated construction and no parking restrictions would go into effect. City Manager stated the following date of Thursday, Feb. 14, 1963. Commissioners advised W. E. Butcher to instruct the Police Department to enforce the No Parking area.

Cab owner, Mickey Fronto, made a request for taxi-cab parking space, to park two extra cabs that he had recently acquired, purchasing said cabs from Maynard Cab. Co. He stated that the Maynard cabs had not parked on meters due to the company having "private off the street parking" facilities. Commissioners and Mayor Protem informed Mr. Fronto that since arrangements had previously been made to regulate the taxi-cab parking, he was advised to discuss the matter with the City Manager, whose duty it is to designate proper parking space according to city ordinance.

Mayor Protem, Bruce Walters stressed the importance of enforcing the collection of past due parking violations and that the Board expected these duties carried out to their fullest capacity and notices sent for every past due ticket issued for parking violations.

City Manager, W. E. Butcher, presented to the Board a letter from the Kentucky Inspection Bureau, Louisville, Kentucky. Mayor Protem read the following letter in its entirety:

WATER SUPPLY IMPROVEMENTS  
PIKEVILLE, KENTUCKY

This will confirm our recent telephone conversation with you regarding the urgent need for the City of Pikeville to extend and strengthen its water distribution system in order to provide adequate fire protection to the built-up areas of the City.

As you will recall from our letter of recommendations dated August 14, 1962, the principal improvements needed for maintaining the



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City's present seventh-class fire insurance classification were in the water distribution system. Not only is the water supply in the older portion of the City inadequate, but approximately 30% of the entire built-up area of the City is completely without hydrant protection.

We are pleased to learn that the City Officials are cognizant of the gravity of this situation and are proceeding as fast as possible under the Public Works System to make these necessary improvements. We wish to co-operate with you in every way possible in this matter; however, in view of the urgency of this situation, and the length of time that these conditions have existed, we cannot continue to justify the City's present fire protection classification, unless we can receive definite assurance that these improvements will be made within a reasonable length of time. In this connection we should appreciate it if you will keep us advised of the status of this situation and at the earliest possible date let us know what action can be expected.
