

# MINUTES } CITY OF PIKEVILLE

At a regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, held at the Starlite Bowling Center on March 20, 1964, the following were present:

Mayor Hambley read the following resolution in its entirety:

WHEREAS, the public crossing of the C & O Railway Company right of way at the lower or northern end of Cline Street in the City of Pikeville known as the Poor Farm crossing, as presently located and maintained, constitutes a hazard to both pedestrian and vehicular traffic using said crossing and is not well adapted to use by the public as a railroad crossing, and

WHEREAS, a less dangerous and more convenient crossing could be established and maintained at a point some 75 or 100 feet west of the present location.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved that the C & O Railway Company be requested to retire and abandon the present crossing and relocate the same at a point approximately 75 to 100 feet west of the present location so as to provide a safer and more convenient pedestrian and vehicular crossing and resolved further that the City Attorney is hereby instructed to give and publish such notice or notices as may be required under existing law and institute such proceedings as may be required to accomplish the above purpose and provide further that a copy of this Resolution duly attested by the City Clerk be furnished to Mr. W.J. Crawford, Supervisor of Tract of the C & O Railway Company, mailed and addressed to him at Pikeville, Kentucky.

Fredrick W. Baker moved the adoption of the foregoing Resolution. Kermit Sexton seconded the motion and upon roll call the vote was as follows:

The Mayor declared the Motion carried and the Resolution adopted.

The following resolution was read by the Mayor in its entirety.

W. E. Butcher, City Manager reported that he had been in negotiations with Mr. Forrest Music of the Auxier Water Company of Auxier, Kentucky for the purchase of one lot of valves and filter controls in the old water plant belonging to the City of Pikeville which have been abandoned and are of no value or use to the City in the operation of its present plant and have very little commercial value other than junk and that Mr. Music has offered to purchase the lot of valves and filter controls for the sum of \$1,000.00 payable \$300.00 down and \$50.00 per month until the balance was paid and recommended that this offer be accepted.

W. E. Butcher produced the check in the sum of \$300.00 tendered by Auxier Water Company to cover the down payment above mentioned.

BE IT RESOLVED that the offer of Auxier Water Company made by Forrest Music reported by W. E. Butcher, City Manager, to purchase the valves and filter controls mentioned above be accepted and that O. T. Hinton, City Attorney, be directed to prepare bill of sale and promissory note for execution by the Mayor and City Clerk and Auxier Water Company to complete the transaction.

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The following Resolution was read by the Mayor in its entirety:

The Mayor announced that the following Notice had been published in the Pike County News in the issue of March 12, 1964, pursuant to the provisions of K.R.S. 82.080, to-wit:

## "NOTICE OF MEETING OF CITY COMMISSIONERS"

All persons interested will take notice that at a regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the City of Pikeville to be held at the Starlite Bowling Center Main Diningroom in the City of Pikeville on Friday, March 20, 1964 at 7:30 P.M., the Board will consider the adoption and approval of certain codes governing buildings, plumbing, electrical and gas installations and housing generally by reference to the codes promulgated and published by the Southern Building Code Congress of Birmingham, Alabama, and the American Society of Mechanical Engineers of New York City, New York, and the National Fire Protection Association of Boston, Massachusetts, as provided by Kentucky Revised Statutes 82.080.

" All citizens and persons owning property within the City limits of the City of Pikeville are invited to attend said meeting and to participate in the considerations above mentioned.

A general discussion of the various codes mentioned in the Notice was held and the following Resolution was offered:

RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners of the City of Pikeville adopt and approve the following codes which shall hereafter govern and apply to all buildings, plumbing, electrical and gas installations and housing generally within the City limits of the City of Pikeville from and after the adoption of this Resolution, to-wit: Southern Standard Building Code, published by Southern Building Code Congress of Birmingham, Alabama, the 1960-61 Revision; the National Plumbing Code published by the American Society of Mechanical Engineers of New York City, New York, identified as ASA A40.8-1955 UDC-696.1001.3; National Electrical Code 1962 published by the National Fire Protection Association of Boston, Massachusetts, identified as NFPA No. 70 ASA c1; Southern Standard Building Code Congress of Birmingham, Alabama, identified as shown above; and Southern Standard Building Code, Part IV--Housing--1960-61 Edition published by the Southern Building Code Congress of Birmingham, Alabama, identified as shown above.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that each of the above mentioned codes be kept on file in the office of the City Clerk and made available for inspection by any resident or owner of property within the City at any time during business hours and that each of said codes be adopted and approved by reference without further publication as provided by Kentucky Revised Statutes 82.080 and under and pursuant to the authority vested in the Board of Commissioners by Kentucky Revised Statutes 86.160 and other applicable statutory provisions.

RESOLVED further that this Resolution become effective immediately upon its adoption.

Kermit Sexton, Commissioner, moved the adoption of the above Resolution and Fredrick W. Baker, Commissioner, seconded the motion. The Mayor called for a vote which was taken as follows:
