The City Clerk read the minutes of the past meetings held in April, 1964.

Mr. W. B. Call asked if any action had been taken on the Happy Hollow right of way. The City Attorney stated that the City has no legal representation due to Mr. Hinton's prior representation of Mr. Call regarding this matter. Mr. Hinton recommended that the City employ an attorney to represent the City regarding the Happy Hollow right of way. City Attorney Hinton said that he would assist any attorney retained to represent the City. The Commission instructed Mr. Butcher to meet with Mr. Call and his attorney to see if this matter could be settled without litigation.

Dr. Rustin presented a survey to the Commission. on 32 homes in Coal Hollow regarding sewage facilities and recommended that they be taken in by the new sewage project.

Mr. Butcher stated that he had talked with John Cline regarding sewage facilities in Coal Hollow and that he was agreeable to sewers being installed any where in his property on Coal Hollow that would not interfere with the road.
